The Need is Everywhere!

Covid-19 has increased demands on Santa Fe area charitable organizations like never before in their history....it 's staggering! Critical service providers of food, shelter and education are experiencing the sharpest increases in demand for services in their history. We need to respond to help that need. ***THAT'S WHERE WE COME IN.***

- **Demand for food from The Food Depot and other food providers has doubled**
- **Family and Youth homeless shelters are overwhelmed and the cost to provide for distancing and isolation has sky-rocketed**
- **Home schooling of kids has impacted non-profits supporting childhood education**
- **The picture for early months of 2021 is not optimistic**
- **The cost of providing services continues to increase as older volunteers are staying home**

LCCF is responding with our largest total Community Grants commitment in our nearly 20-year history- 21 grants totaling \$150,000. This includes a \$10,000 grant in March to the Santa Fe Community Foundation's Covid-19 Response Fund. We are sharply focused on organizations providing critical services in Health and Wellbeing and Education with a special emphasis on food and shelter. All 21 organizations to which we contributed have meaningful, positive impact in the Santa Fe Community.

In this special edition of El Vocero, we are providing an overview of the drastic needs in Santa Fe and examples of the impact our grants have had on non-profit organizations we have supported.

2020 Grants From LCCF

SUPPORTING THE NEEDS IN OUR COMMUNITY

Bag n' Hand Food Pantry – Provides nutritious food in a caring environment for the hungry.

Bienvenidos Outreach – Provides food and clothing to those in need.

R&R for Vets – Assists low income veterans unable to make repairs to their homes due to lack of resources.

Casa Milagro – Provides a sustainable, safe and therapeutic place for formerly homeless residents.

Feeding Santa Fe – Provides supplementary food to hungry families and individuals.

The Food Depot – Northern New Mexico's only food bank, provides hunger relief to 42,500 people in nine counties through a combination of direct service programs and support of a network of over 145 partner nonprofits.

The Interfaith Community Shelter (at Pete's Place) – Provides safety, food and clothing for homeless men, women and children of all ages in Santa Fe.

Kitchen Angels – Provides nutritious meals to homebound individuals with chronic, life threatening or terminal illnesses.

La Familia Medical Center – Provides expert medical, dental and behavioral health services to individuals and families in need regardless of ability to pay or income.

Solace Crisis Treatment Center – Provides therapeutic clinical services to children and adult victims of sexual assault and other violent crimes.

St Elizabeth Shelter – Assists homeless individuals and families with shelter, food, and counseling.

Breakthrough Santa Fe – Supports underserved middle school kids to help them forge a path to college; focused on first in family to go to college.

Girls Inc – Inspires girls with mentoring and real solutions to unique issues challenging girls.

Literacy Volunteers of Santa Fe – Provides tutoring services in basic English literacy skills to nearly 400 adults (including several Las Campanas employees) and disconnected youth.

Reading Quest – Provides quality tutoring to striving child readers.

Santa Fe Children's Museum – Provides programs and activities to children and families to develop a sense of joy and discovery in the arts, sciences and humanities.

Santa Fe Alliance for Science – Supports volunteers (75 scientists and engineers) linked with SF public school kids to enhance STEM learning.

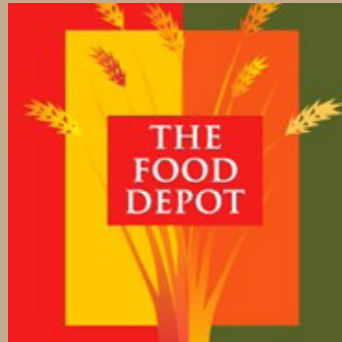
Santa Fe Community Fund's Covid-19 Relief Fund – Supports local organizations impacted by the COVID pandemic. LCCF made a grant in March 2020.

Silver Bullet Productions – Provides educational film making programs in tribal communities.

STEM Santa Fe – Mentors 750 middle and high school kids in STEM disciplines.

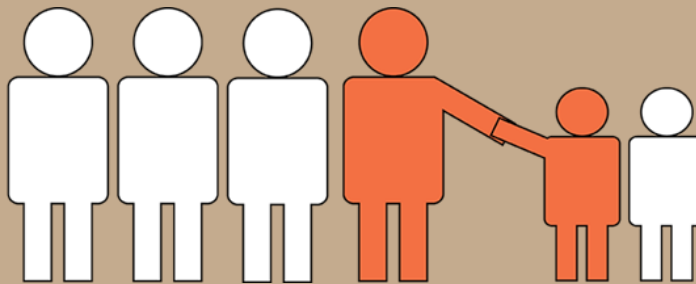
Youth Shelters and Family Services – Provides shelter and support for homeless, runaway and in-crisis youth.

Meet Some of the Organizations We Support



THE FOOD DEPOT

The Food Depot, northern New Mexico's only food bank, has provided hunger relief for 26 years. Hunger has been a persistent challenge in New Mexico even before the COVID-19 public health crisis. Within the first two weeks of its COVID-19 Response, The Food Depot saw a dramatic increase in demand for hunger relief – up 30%. Between March and September, we incurred additional expenses of \$1.5 million. The Food Depot exhausted its 2020 food purchase budget in the first two months of the crisis. Due to the sharp increase in food insecurity, The Food Depot is projected to distribute over 10 million pounds of food in 2020—8.6 million meals. Between January and September 2020, our data shows a 66% increase in food distribution over the same time period in 2019. It is projected that in 2020, 17.4% of people will be food insecure in The Food Depot's service area.....and 33.7% of children will be food insecure.



BAG 'N' HAND FOOD PANTRY

An outreach ministry of St. John's United Methodist Church, Bag 'N' Hand Food Pantry is operated by volunteers and works as a partner agency of The Food Depot of Santa Fe. It is one of the largest food pantries in northern New Mexico, providing fresh produce and packaged food in a friendly and caring environment to hungry people – 25% children and 30% seniors – in the Santa Fe community.

FEEDING SANTA FE



An all-volunteer organization, Feeding Santa Fe is partnered with the Food Depot and provides a drive through food pantry. Those in need more than quadrupled with Covid-19 and they now distribute to an average weekly client load each of 2,700, with peaks as high as 4,000. Many new clients have never before experienced or ever thought they would experience food insecurity.

KITCHEN ANGELS



Kitchen Angels has highlighted Thanksgiving over the past 28 years, welcoming visiting volunteers from throughout the community and cooking up a fabulous feast. This year we will still be sending out beautiful holiday meals, but with far fewer volunteer hands. We need to keep our volunteer numbers low to ensure adequate physical distancing between people in the kitchen. Fewer volunteers will make Thanksgiving more challenging and less festive, but clients will still receive a holiday feast prepared and delivered with love.



LA FAMILIA MEDICAL CENTER

La Familia Medical Center provides expert medical, dental and behavioral health services to all individuals and families, regardless of income or ability to pay, including outpatient primary health care, dental care, case management, referrals, and street outreach services to the homeless community in Santa Fe County, working closely with other service agencies that provide services to the homeless.

THE INTERFAITH COMMUNITY SHELTER AT PETE'S PLACE



- “Through the incredible generosity of both private and public funders, we were able to house up to 46 of our older, more vulnerable guests at a local motel in order to provide them the ability to socially distance. Most of these individuals have been homeless anywhere from two to eight years.”
- “With the help of our amazing corps of volunteers, ICS served 56,726 meals, provided 20,319 total nights of overnight shelter to 1,315 individuals and distributed 41,220 articles of clothing.”

BIENVENIDOS OUTREACH

In the month of March, Bienvenidos Outreach served 808 boxes of food and 1,155 lunches to the homeless and low-income families, far exceeding pre-Covid-19 support. Because older volunteers have opted to stay home, a 5-6 person staff is striving to meet needs.



ST. ELIZABETH SHELTER

St Elizabeth Shelter has experienced a huge uptick in homeless due to Covid-19. The Shelter tests all guests and staff, closely monitor guests' movements, and closed its Men's and Casa Familia emergency shelters to the public. Cost of providing services has increased exponentially due to the need to house guests in local hotels to accommodate social distancing and isolation.



LITERACY VOLUNTEERS OF SANTA FE



Literacy Volunteers of Santa Fe is dedicated to providing free, quality tutoring to adults in reading, writing, and speaking English to strengthen our community, families and workforce. It has been in existence for 25 years, and has served 13,780 students with 4902 tutors. Literacy Volunteers directly support Las Campanas employees.

CASA MILAGRO

Casa Milagro is a safe, trusting, and nurturing community for adults recovering from homelessness and debilitating mental illness.

Please forward our grateful thanks to the Las Campanas Community Endowment Fund.....

On any given night, we shelter 125 people through our five residential programs. By year's end we will have housed nearly 700 people and provided outreach assistance to another 1,000 or more through referrals and distributions of clothes, food supplies, mail and other needed items. But what we're most proud of is successfully placing 63 percent of those former residents into housing when they leave us. And Casa Familia is even more successful with 69 percent of its guests achieving housing (58 percent of the single women and 85 percent of family members and children).....

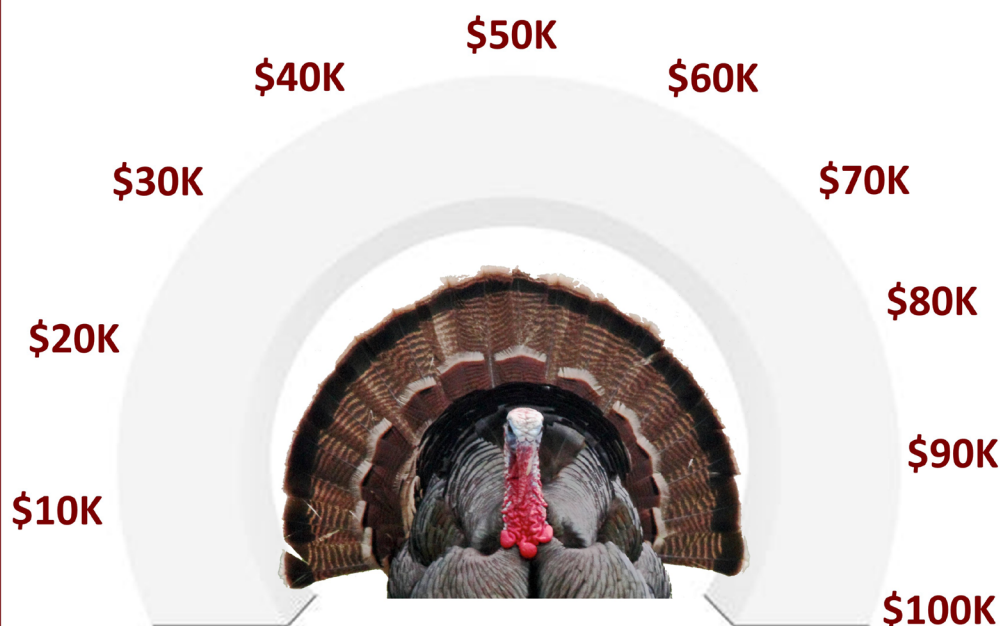

PHILANTHROPY SPOTLIGHTS

Donor Highlight: Las Campanas Community Funds

Our community extends much farther than the hustle and bustle of the Santa Fe Plaza. Out in the quiet, rolling high desert hills of Las Campanas, the members of the Las Campanas community through the auspices of the Las Campanas Community Funds, have taken tremendous steps to aid our community. Started in the early 2000s, the Las Campanas Community Grants Fund was founded to provide grants to those organizations most in need. Over the years, due to the generosity of the Las Campanas network, the Fund has expanded in both size and purpose. Last year, the Fund gave out 10 grants of \$10,000 each, the largest amount it had given in a single year. The Las Campanas Scholarship Fund gives out about 60 scholarships, totaling over \$110,000 each year, to Las Campanas employees and their families, with recipients attending schools ranging from vocational schools to Princeton. Through the administrative support of the Santa Fe Community Foundation, the Las Campanas Community Fund is supporting the prosperity of the Santa Fe community and beyond.

Over \$1 Million granted since inception:

- \$665,000 for Community Grants
- \$466,000 for Scholarships
