Dear Las Campanas Friends and Neighbors,

Because of the generosity of Las Campanas members since 2002, the Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) has awarded 213 grants totaling more than \$1,400,000 to Santa Fe nonprofit organizations, serving people in need and helping to improve the quality of life in Santa Fe. With this Annual Holiday Appeal, we are asking you to bring the spirit and sense of community of Las Campanas alive and to support our beloved Santa Fe at a time when this community's needs remain high.

As the COVID-19 pandemic endures and economic uncertainty evolves, Santa Fe's local nonprofit organizations continue to serve basic human needs, with increased demand for services, such as shelter, food, clothing, job security, vulnerable population outreach, and youth education programs. These are once again the priority funding areas for LCCF grants this year.

**Our 2022 goals are to raise \$500,000 and to achieve 50% participation from members.**

- **Again, This Year...**With a contribution of \$2,500 or more, you may designate where you would like your gift to be directed from the following list of 26 prescreened organizations. What a great way to be a part of LCCF and support a favorite agency from our list of grantees.

- Donations pledged by December 10<sup>th</sup> will be awarded a 10% boost from matching funds up to an additional \$25,000.

## NOTEWORTHY<sup>1</sup>

New Mexico currently ranks last in the nation (51) on the Opportunity Index, a multidimensional indicator of opportunity based on economic, education, health, and community conditions. An early interest in STEM is the greatest predictor of future education success.

In 2020, La Familia's providers saw more than 2,000 children under the age of five. Over 65% of our families are under-served when it comes to their healthcare, with 33% being uninsured and 32% on Medicaid.

The 2019 Santa Fe County Youth Risk and Resiliency Survey reports that 41.6% of high school students felt sadness or hopelessness; 16.6% seriously considered suicide; and 9.4% made an attempt.

## HEALTH



### Bag 'n Hand Food Pantry

Distributes nutritious food in a caring environment to the hungry in Santa Fe.



### Bienvenidos Outreach

Supplies food and clothing to those in need in Santa Fe.



### Big Brothers Big Sisters Mountain Region

Makes meaningful, monitored matches between adult volunteers and children ages six to eighteen.



### Cooking with Kids

Educates and empowers children and families to make healthy food choices through hands-on nutrition education with fresh, affordable foods.



### The Food Depot

Supports acute hunger relief services across northern New Mexico from mobile and permanent pantries and a network of partner agencies.



### Kitchen Angels

Delivers free nutritious meals to homebound individuals living with chronic, life threatening or terminal illnesses.



### La Familia Medical Center

Provides medical, dental and behavioral health services to individuals and families in need, regardless of ability to pay.



### Memory Care Alliance

Provides support, education, and resources for families living with Alzheimer's and other dementia-related illnesses.



### Punching Out Parkinson's - Rock Steady Boxing

Assists those with Parkinson's with postural stability and gait difficulty to improve their quality of life.

## HUMAN SERVICES



### Adelante Program of SFPS

Provides a wide range of support services for Pre-K to 12th grade students and their families experiencing homelessness.



### CASA First

Supports court-appointed volunteer advocacy to assist and advocate for abused and neglected foster children so they can be safe, have a permanent home and thrive.



### Esperanza Shelter

Provides trauma-informed care to individuals and family members experiencing domestic violence to break the cycle of violence.



### Life Link

Helps homeless and displaced individuals and families achieve self sufficiency through comprehensive support programs.



### Solace Crisis Treatment Center

Empowers children and adults who have been victims of sexual assault.



### St. Elizabeth Shelters

Provides emergency shelter, food and services to the most vulnerable, with a goal to end the cycle of homelessness altogether.



### The Sky Center

Offers free youth suicide prevention counseling services to teens and families.



### Youth Shelters and Family Services

Delivers life-changing shelter and support for homeless, runaway, and in-crisis youth.

Thank you for supporting Community Grants!

As described herein, LCCF has selected 26 outstanding nonprofit organizations providing Education, Health, and Human Services support to residents in Santa Fe. Without exception, these agencies are creating brighter tomorrows for so many! We are pleased to share with you how our family of grantees came together.

LCCF is a donor-directed fund of Santa Fe Community Foundation (SFCF). In order for LCCF to optimally reach those in need, we leverage SFCF's comprehensive list of prescreened, highly effective local organizations making outsized positive impacts in our communities. Our donors may designate gifts greater than \$2,500 to specific nonprofits on our grantee list for the year.

## **Our Selection Criteria**

The LCCF Community Grants committee works hand-in-hand with SFCF's grants staff to reach local organizations where our dollars will have the greatest impact.

- Our grantees are SFCF approved and vetted nonprofit agencies serving education, health, and human services in the Santa Fe metro area. For grantees who serve a larger geographic area, we restrict our grant to needs in Santa Fe county.
- Our funding is distributed evenly between the above service areas, with grants generally ranging from \$5,000 to \$15,000, depending on the size of the organization.
- Our review process provides consideration to organizations where Las Campanas members volunteer.
- Our final list of 26 grantees was presented to the LCCF Board for individual discussion, review, and formal approval.

We have all been experiencing uncertainty and volatility. However, many in our communities have been disproportionately impacted since 2020 by a myriad of health, economic or educational stressors such as the COVID pandemic, current economic situation, rising costs for basic needs, and challenges with virtual learning or understaffed classrooms.

Santa Fe's nonprofit organizations have experienced unprecedented service demand increases. In 2021, members at Las Campanas rallied to support them by increasing donations to LCCF Community Grants to more than \$425K with 40%-member participation rate. We can aim higher as our community's needs continue to grow in 2022.

Let us rise to the call to support those in need in our community during these still unprecedented times. Whether this is your part- or full-time home, Santa Fe provides us all with an unparalleled lifestyle. Let us give what we can to serve our community. Your one gift will be serving so many.

## Inward to Employees with Scholarships Outward to Santa Fe with Community Grants

Members of The Club at Las Campanas have long recognized the importance of philanthropic action in the Santa Fe community by supporting local nonprofit organizations and investing in the future of our employees.

Since 2002, Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) has operated on behalf of members as an independent donor-directed fund of the Santa Fe Community Foundation (SFCF). They provide us access to amazing talent helping us reach deep into the community without incurring the administrative burden or expense of managing a private foundation.

LCCF's two areas of giving are:

- **Scholarships** for Las Campanas employees and their families
- **Community Grants** helping people in need and supporting the quality of life in Santa Fe

These are supported by Las Campanas member donations and planned gifts, earned interest from the funds' corpus, and fundraising activities such as the annual Scholarship Classic, Las Campanas Art Sale, Studio Artists Tour, and Annual Community Grants Campaign. Our programs enhance the sense of community within our Club.

LCCF receives no revenue from The Club at Las Campanas and has no paid staff. The LCCF Board—a volunteer committee comprised of Las Campanas members—makes all grant and scholarship decisions annually, with member input and with administrative support from SFCF.

The Board strives to make LCCF an attractive choice to a broad cross section of our members for collective community outreach. All donations to LCCF are fully tax deductible.
