MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD



Las Campanas Community Funds

Dear Members,

Welcome to the first Annual Report of the Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF). We can enthusiastically report that 2021 was a year unmatched since the beginning of the Fund in 2002.

The all-volunteer LCCF Board's mission is to deliver maximum value of member donations in direct support of community nonprofits and employee scholarships. In 2021, LCCF raised \$876,215, awarded scholarships and grants totaling \$697,061, with expenses totaling only \$35,604.

Our first Annual Report details our two major programs, Community Grants and Scholarships. Through the Community Grants Program, we award grants to non-profit organizations in the Santa Fe community serving those in need. Funds are raised primarily from the Annual Holiday Appeal, but also from the LCCF Art Sale, the sale of Bluebird Houses, and earnings from our invested reserve. The Scholarship Program supports Las Campanas employees and their families in their pursuit of higher education with scholarships and Teen Savings Accounts (TSA). LCCF hosts the annual Scholarship Classic & Employee Appreciation Day to raise funds. Member donations to both programs more than doubled any prior year.

As fellow members at Las Campanas, we strive to represent your generosity to the community's nonprofits. We also recognize our wonderful employees through scholarships and secondary education. With these two programs, we are honored to gift on your behalf. Without the extraordinary generosity of our membership, this would not be possible.

In 2021, LCCF renewed its long-standing relationship with the Santa Fe Community Foundation (SFCF). As SFCF welcomed a new CEO, Christopher Goett, LCCF enhanced the process for selecting nonprofit grantees, established Guidelines for managing the LCCF quasi-endowment, and renewed SFCF's management of our reserve funds. Our relationship with SFCF is detailed in this Annual Report.

In changes to our Board and Committees, we welcomed Kim Ariano, John Bernstein, and Lucy Higgins as new members, expressed our gratitude to retiring Gary Fisher and Lisa Shover-Kackley for their dedicated service, and added several non-Board members to our three program committees. We extend our thanks to Las Campanas management and staff, Al Antonez, Boya Lou, and Elizabeth Egelhoff, for their continuing support.

As we continue our work supporting Santa Fe community nonprofits and our scholarship students, we welcome your feedback on our mission, our approaches, and our results.

LCCF is making a difference and your sustaining generosity makes it possible. Thank you.

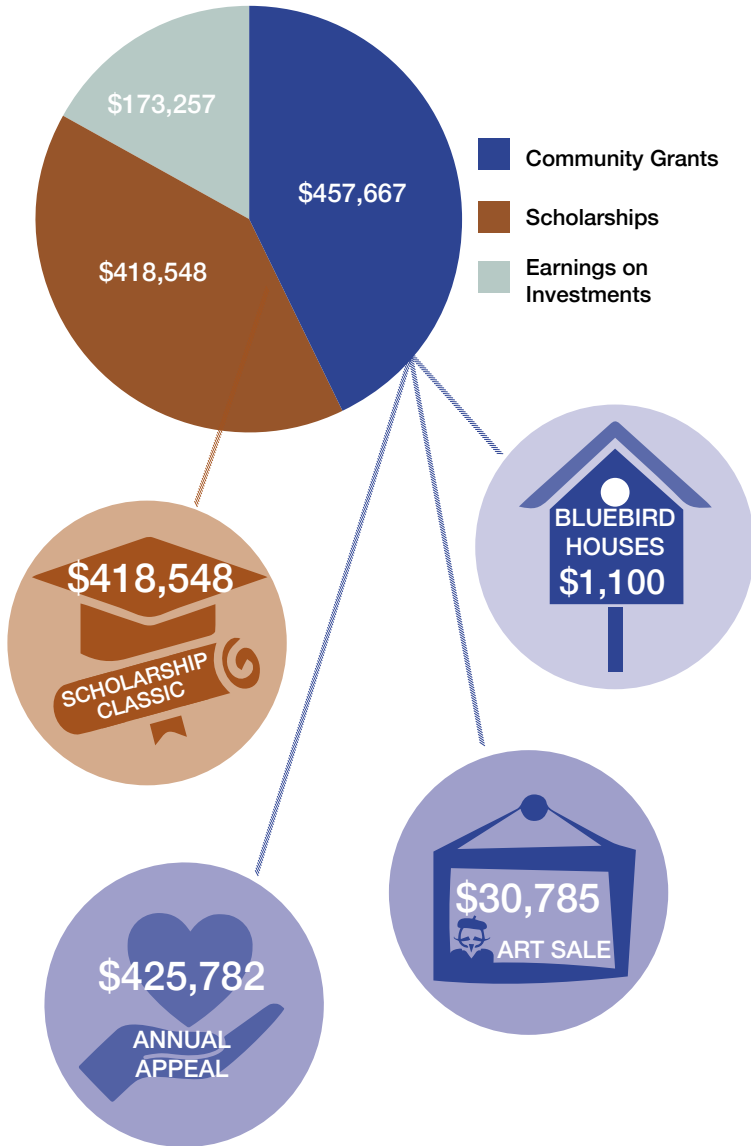

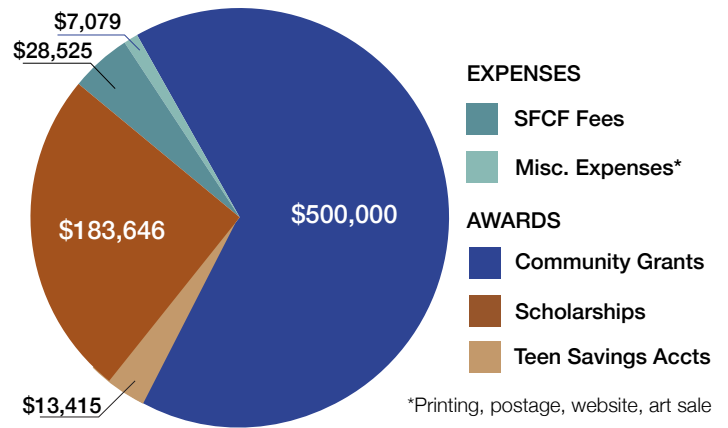
2021 REVENUE

2021 COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM IMPACT

The Community Grants program in 2021 was like no other in LCCF history. Thanks to the generosity of our members and a strong year in financial markets, we awarded \$500,000 in grants to 35 Santa Fe area nonprofits. Donations in response to the Annual Holiday Appeal were double the best prior year (see bar chart to the right) and in a new feature, 21 members designated gifts of \$120,000 to 21 nonprofits.

The LCCF Art Sale benefits the Community Grants Program. 2021 was another great year with \$30,785 raised, reflecting year over year growth for this program. And, coming this September, an LCCF Studio Artists Tour, featuring member artists, will be held.

With the addition of new members on the Community Grants Committee, we completed a full review of the grant program. New initiatives are planned including:

- making multi-year commitments to select nonprofits
- awarding one-time grants for special projects
- setting a goal to award \$500,000 in grants annually
- awarding a mix of large and small grants to 25-30 grantees per year
- enhancing analysis of our grantees' finances
- maintaining our focus on health, human services, and education
- giving special consideration of grants to nonprofits where Las Campanas members and donors volunteer or serve on Board
- creating initiatives in the community to more broadly recognize our members generosity.

The LCCF Community Grants program offers members an easy way to experience the joy of philanthropy and support a range of nonprofits with a single or designated gift. We wish to make the program appealing to as broad a cross section of the Las Campanas membership as possible.

LCCF, on behalf of Las Campanas members, is making a difference in the Santa Fe community. We welcome your feedback.

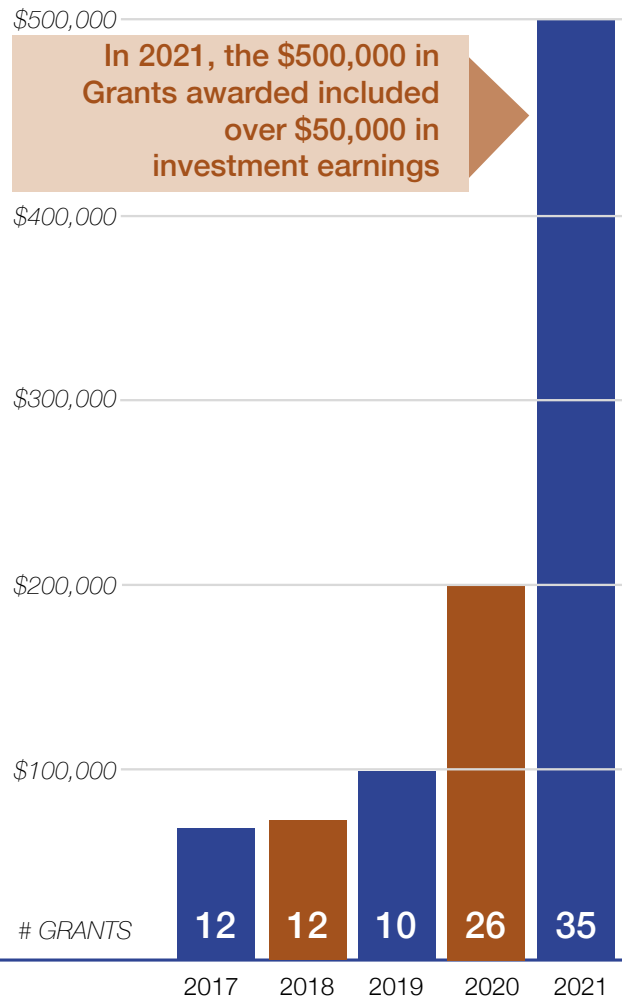

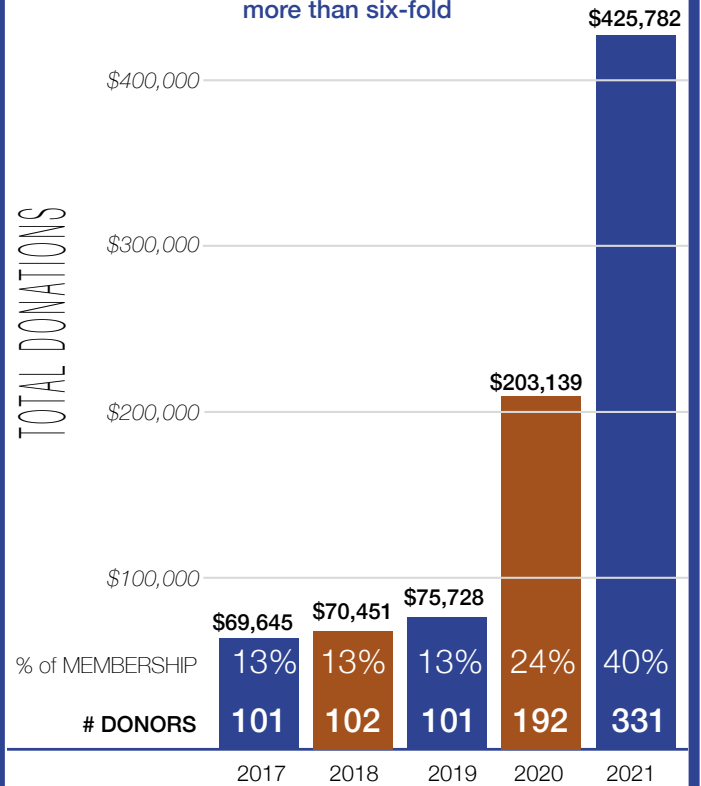

2021 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM IMPACT

In 2012, the Las Campanas Community Funds Scholarship Program was officially formed with actual operation beginning in 2014. The Program has “come a long way baby” since 2014 when we awarded our first scholarships totaling almost \$59,000 to 17 students. It has now grown to over **\$183,000** awarded to 34 scholars—85% are Club employees. Our Teen Savings Account (TSA) initiative for high school age students has proven to be a “feeder” program for Scholarships with **16** enrollees and over **\$13,400** in savings at the Guadalupe Credit Union in Santa Fe.

The legacy of the Scholarship Program is exemplified by the many employees or their children who have graduated from colleges, universities, and technical/vocational schools while being supported by the Program. Just to mention a few graduates: the Arroyo Brothers—Alex and Rene, John Baca, Isaiah Brooks-Sena, Wyatt Egelhoff, Jason Brandon Lopez, Ximena de los Rios, Vanessa Sena, and Luis Terrazas. All of these scholars either worked full- or part-time at The Club at Las Campanas while attending school full time.



Alejandro (Alex) Arroyo graduated from the University of New Mexico in 2015 with a BS Degree in Criminal Justice. He is now giving back to the Santa Fe Community as a Senior Patrol Officer on the Santa Fe Police Force. As the Team Leader of a Canine Unit, Alex is responsible for the Four-Person Team’s training, veterinarian requirements, equipment needs, maintenance, etc.



After graduating from the University of New Mexico in 2021, Rene Arroyo obtained a Master’s Degree in Exercise Science from the California University of Pennsylvania. He was recently named the Head Trainer at Sporting Kansas City II, the minor league affiliate of the highly regarded Major League Soccer Team, Sporting Kansas City. Rene’s working career at Las Campanas was spent with Food & Beverage Operations.

Our Members can be proud to be able to support so many of our continuing scholars and graduates from the Scholarship Program. It is a living legacy to be sure. While the graduates above graduated from New Mexico schools, we now have students attending institutions in Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, Kansas, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, and Texas.

ABOUT THE TEEN SAVINGS ACCOUNT

As part of the Scholarship Program, the Teen Savings Account Program (TSA) establishes custodial savings accounts for high school employees or high school children of employees with a grant of \$500 per individual. The accounts are held by the Guadalupe Credit Union in Santa Fe*. Additional contributions by the teen or their family are matched by the LCCF Scholarship Program up to \$500 per year. The funds in these TSA accounts may only be used for costs related to post-secondary education, such as college or technical school.

In the words of TSA Coordinator, Mike Everett, “*The TSA has proven to be a ‘feeder’ program for the Scholarship program itself. The great thing is that the TSA accounts for high school students who ‘age out’ can keep growing if they or their parents, relatives, and/or friends continue to contribute year after year.*”*

*Prosperity Works of Albuquerque provides administrative and financial services for the TSA Program.

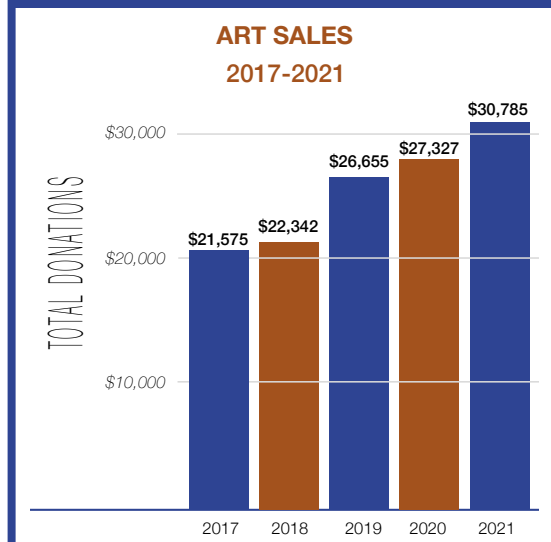

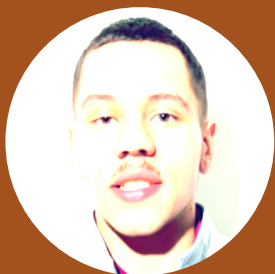

The Santa Fe Community Foundation (SFCF) and the Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) have enjoyed notable success working together in the interest of the Santa Fe community since 2002.

SFCF is an IRS approved 501(c)3, publicly supported, tax-exempt organization serving the Santa Fe and Northern New Mexico communities for over 40 years. SFCF provides support to LCCF in such areas as investment of funds corpus, vetting and approving nonprofits, grant administration, disbursement of funds, and related services. As a 501(c)3, SFCF accepts all donations to the LCCF and provides appropriate tax acknowledgments. SFCF receives an annual fee for their full range of services in the amount of 1.5% of invested funds.

LCCF is an independent fund(s) working for the benefit of the community in partnership with the SFCF. As donations are made directly to SFCF, they are further identified for deposit to either the Grants or Scholarship Program. The LCCF Committee independently makes all grant and scholarship decisions on behalf of its member/donors, utilizing the administrative and financial services of SFCF as noted above.

In 2021, SFCF managed 500+ funds totaling over \$119M and awarded grants in Northern New Mexico totaling over \$11M.
