Welcome to the 2025 LCCF Impact Report—a celebration of another extraordinary year made possible by you, the members of The Club at Las Campanas. Thanks to your generosity, engagement, and belief in our mission, LCCF achieved record-setting results in Community Grants, Scholarships, and the Arts.

We recently awarded more than \$1.2 million in grants to 33 Santa Fe-area nonprofits, supporting critical work in health, education, and human services. We also provided meaningful scholarship support to students pursuing higher education—an investment in the future workforce and in families connected to our Club community. On behalf of every grantee and scholar, thank you for making these opportunities possible.

In the pages ahead, you'll find highlights from our committee chairs—John Bernstein (Community Grants), Kim Ariano (Scholarships), and Karen Dealy and Bob Gouy (Arts). Their leadership, along with the dedication of many volunteers, has been essential to this year's success. A special milestone in 2025 was the inaugural Gala and Arts Auction at the Hacienda, a sold-out event that raised more than \$230,000 for the Community Grants Fund. It was a beautiful example of creativity and generosity coming together for the greater good.

This year also marked an important organizational step forward. After thoughtful evaluation, the Board made the decision to transition our funds to the New Mexico Community Trust. NMCT's strong leadership, responsiveness, and deep community expertise will serve LCCF well as we continue to grow.

Looking ahead, your Board is exploring several strategic initiatives, including a 529 College Savings Program, an Employee Assistance Fund, expanded Planned Giving options, and opportunities to deepen community awareness and participation. Each reflects our commitment to evolving with the needs of the community we serve.

I am profoundly grateful to our Board and to the many volunteers whose time and talent keep expenses low and impact high. We also extend heartfelt appreciation to Susan and Stephen Robeck for their years of invaluable service as they embark on new adventures.

As my term concludes, I offer my sincere thanks for the privilege of serving as Board Chair. It has been challenging at times, but deeply rewarding because of what this community accomplishes together. I am delighted to pass the leadership to Lucy Higgins, whose vision, dedication, and energy will guide LCCF into an inspiring next chapter.

It has been an incredible year—one defined by generosity, compassion, and meaningful impact. Thank you for being part of it.

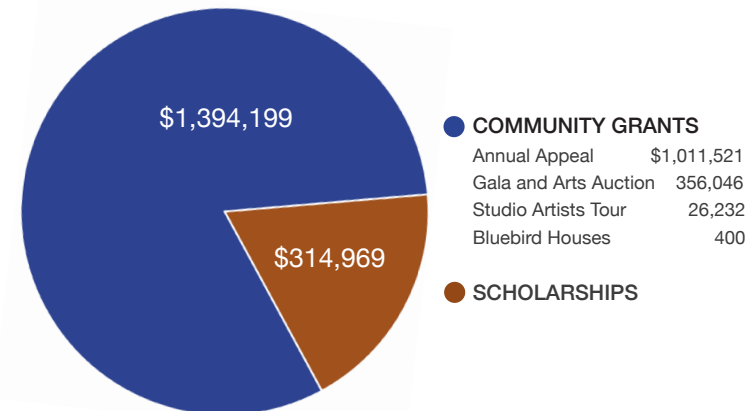
OUR MISSION

2025 Financial Impact

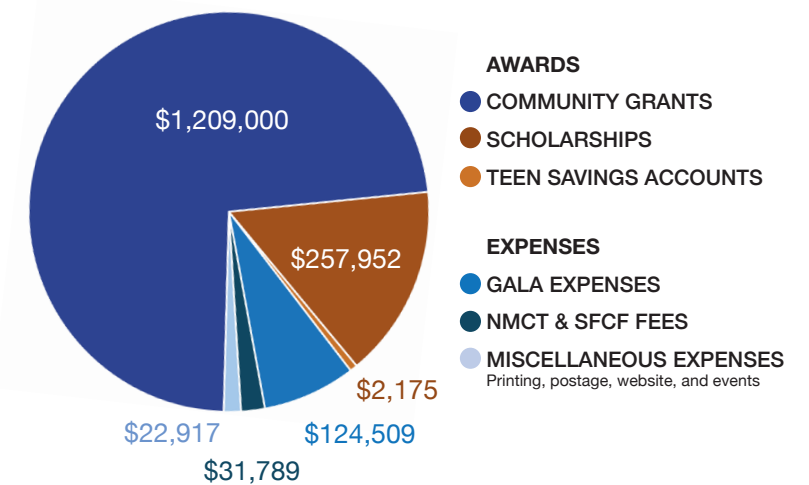
2025 REVENUE

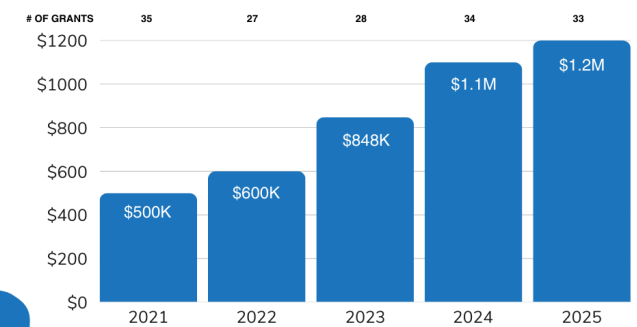
2025 Account Balances include \$174,156 in investment income and Community Grants of \$1.2M distributed in January 2025.

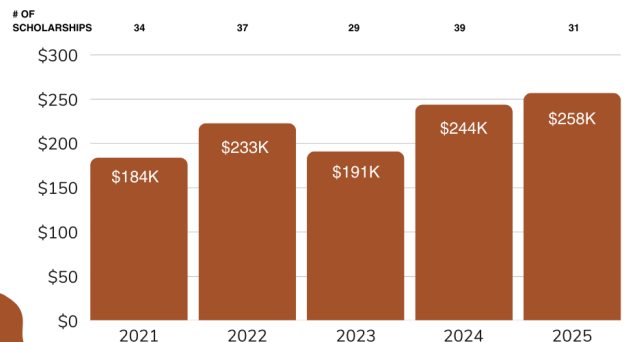
GRANTS AWARDED 2021 – 2025

Thanks to your extraordinary generosity, 2025 was another landmark year for the Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) Grants Program. Together, we distributed more than \$1.2 million—a record setting investment in 33 exceptional nonprofit organizations serving the Santa Fe community. Whether you participated in the vibrant Gala and Arts Auction, purchased a bluebird house, or contributed through our year-end appeal, every gift directly supports organizations meeting critical needs in Health, Education, and Human Services. We can be deeply proud of the difference this collective effort is making for those facing hardship in our community.

This year, many of you chose to designate all or part of your contributions to specific organizations, totaling over \$300,000 of grants made on your behalf. Your personal commitments strengthen the work of organizations you care about most, and we are honored to facilitate those gifts.

The Grants Committee undertook a thorough review of community needs and of each applicant's mission, leadership, and measurable impact. After careful evaluation, we allocated roughly one third of total grant funding to each of our three program areas, reflecting our balanced and longstanding commitment to the most urgent and essential services in Santa Fe. Our average grant size reached an all time high of \$37,000, with individual awards ranging from \$21,000 to \$78,000. Those increases are a testament to the generosity of our donors.

We are especially proud to share a major step forward for LCCF this year. In each program area, we selected one outstanding grantee to receive a three year commitment of at least \$100,000. As any nonprofit leader will tell you, the only thing more valuable than receiving a grant is knowing that support will be there in the years ahead. These multi-year awards offer stability, encourage long term planning, and demonstrate our deep belief in the impact these organizations are making.

My heartfelt thanks to each and every one of you who contributed to this phenomenal effort. Your generosity is improving lives, strengthening families, and building a more compassionate community. Together, we are creating real and lasting change in Santa Fe.

GRANTEE SELECTION AND AWARD PROCESS

LCCF Community Grants Committee does extensive research into many nonprofit organizations working in education, health, and human services—our three focus areas.

Site visits are conducted annually by LCCF Board members and Club members who volunteer at the candidate organizations. Information about existing community engagement by Club members may be considered as part of the review process.

The Committee meets frequently in the Fall to select the grantees and then seeks approval from the LCCF Board.

New Mexico Community Trust (NMCT) confirms eligibility of the prospective grantees and disperses funds in January after the total funding amount is confirmed.

It is our practice to begin with baseline grants of \$5,000 - \$15,000 to an organization, depending on size of its operating budget. This amount represents \$400K across the 33 nonprofits this year. Grant amounts to some organizations are increased through designation requests from our member donors; extra funds are distributed at the recommendation of the Grants Committee with approval of the Board.

All of our grant awards are to the unrestricted operating budget of the organizations. As a result of site visits by the LCCF Community Grants Committee and vetting done by our partner, NMCT, we are confident that the nonprofits' leadership teams know best how to apply these grants to maximize community impact.

2025 was a remarkable year for the Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) Scholarship Program, and its success is a direct reflection of your generosity and belief in our students. Because of you, we awarded \$257,952 in scholarships to 31 deserving scholars, including 10 new recipients beginning their educational journeys with renewed confidence. This year, 90% of our scholars were Club employees across numerous departments, and 10% were children of employees. Their commitment to learning enriches our community and embodies the spirit of Las Campanas.

Our scholars attended 22 colleges, universities, and technical schools in 13 states, pursuing an inspiring range of fields—Business Administration, Criminal Justice, Early Childhood Education, Geology, Hospitality, Medicine, Musical Theater, Neuroscience, and more. Their ambitions are as diverse as their backgrounds, each striving to build a brighter future for themselves, their families, and their communities.

In response to the rising cost of higher education, LCCF expanded its support in 2025 to include eligible on-campus room and board. And we are continuing to grow. In 2026, we anticipate further strengthening the program with the addition of 529 College Savings Plan support, offering long-term educational stability and opportunity for even more students. None of these achievements would be possible without you. Your gifts do more than fund tuition—they ignite possibility, reduce financial stress, and open doors to new experiences.

Your generosity makes a profound and lasting difference. Thank you for your compassion, your support, and your belief in the power of education. Together, we are helping turn our scholars' dreams into reality.
