Our scholarships directly impact these individuals and additionally improve the lives of all those around them: family, friends, and the communities in which they live and work. When they apply for our scholarships, every scholarship recipient must write an essay indicating why they are worthy of our help. Inward to Employees with Scholarships Outward to Santa Fe with Community Grants

Since 2002, the members of The Club at Las Campanas have recognized the importance of balancing support to nonprofit organizations serving Santa Fe with the need to invest in the future of our employees.

The Las Campanas Community Funds (LCCF) supports:

- **Community Grants** helping people in need and supporting the quality of life in Santa Fe through donations to local nonprofits
- **Scholarships** for Las Campanas employees and their families.

Las Campanas member donations and planned gifts, earned interest from the funds' corpus, and fundraising activities such as the annual Scholarship Classic and Las Campanas Art Sale, support LCCF's two areas of giving.

LCCF is an independent, donor-directed funding program of the Santa Fe Community Foundation (SFCF). As a donor-directed fund, LCCF utilizes the financial and grants administrative services at SFCF. The LCCF Board, with annual member input, makes all grant and scholarship decisions independently.

LCCF receives no revenue from The Club at Las Campanas, has no paid staff, and is managed by a volunteer board comprised of Las Campanas members. All donations to LCCF are fully tax deductible.
