Our Projects

Education and Children's Home: This project aim is to design and create modern, self-sustaining, high-tech, family style communities in which orphans live in a home setting or with surrogate parents and grandparents in a family setting, receive quality education, learn practical family living and job skills, for future oriented high-tech skills to prepare them for their future and for leadership roles in the country.

Vocational /Youth Skill Trainings: This project aim is to address the issues (1. Role and Value conflicts 2. Pressures for Performance in schools and colleges 3. Career Decisions and Unemployment 4. Coping with Pressures of Living 5. Emotional and Sexual Adjustment 7.Lack of knowledge on life) both in institutionalize programmes and out-reach activities targeted towards the youth on development, to stand on their own legs and get employment.

Health Awareness & Free medical Camps: The project main aim is to create awareness on the health problems, to provide information about the chronic diseases, to educate the people the people to avail the services of the Primary Health Centers, Counsel the people to avoid the traditional treatment system, to supply the free medicines to the tribal people, to reduce the health problems by using the non-traditional medicines, to involve them in immunization program to avoid chronic diseases, taking care of the pregnant women during the gestation period, create awareness and educating them about the preventive methods.

Environment: This project principal aim is to ensure environmental stability and maintenance of ecological balance including atmospheric equilibrium, which is vital for sustenance of all life forms, human, animal and plants. The derivation of direct economic benefit is to be subordinated to this principal aim.

Other Awareness Camps/needly Trainings/surveys: This program aim is to conducts surveys, awareness camps, and provide needy trainings on various Acts because to impart knowledge on Right To Information Act, Right To Education Act, Domestic Violence Act, Environment Acts, etc.

Management of volunteers, partners/ network agencies: This Program main aim is to select qualified, suitable, honest volunteers and NGOs in all areas in our state and provide needy capacity building trainings to the needy volunteers and NGOs for getting needy information through surveys.

Background Information & Need of the Project

Alfa Omega Children's Home operates from a rented facility at 597 Jalan Mulia 21, Taman Mulia Pajam Mantin, 71700 Negeri Sembilan, Malaysia, housing nearly 20 children and 5 staff members.

Pajam Mantin lies near Nilai in Negeri Sembilan, about 30-40 km from KLIA via accessible highways and bus routes from Nilai Komuter station ,

This semi-rural setting amid low poverty areas supports projects aiding local vulnerable children from B40 families. Local Poverty Context Negeri Sembilan maintains near-zero hardcore poverty status as of 2024, with only temporary cases around 120 households receiving aid for income generation through jobs or businesses. Statewide absolute poverty incidence hovers at 3.8-5.4%,

lower than national averages, but small settlements near Mantin face challenges from urban migration and limited opportunities.

Other orphanages like Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak-anak Yatim & Miskin (PEYAKIN) highlight ongoing needs for child welfare in the region. Capacity and Operations. The home, founded in 2023 by Ravichandran & Jaya Ietchumi with prior experience, provides shelter, food, healthcare, and empowerment programs in a rented space suited for 20 children and 5 staff. Proximity to universities like INTI Nilai aids potential partnerships for education or volunteering.

Tailored Project Suggestions Leverage your small-scale setup for targeted initiatives benefiting nearby poor kampungs. Expand nutrition and health checks for the 20 children, partnering with local aid. Community skills workshops (e.g., job training) for B40 families in Pajam-Mantin. School supply drives and tuition, collaborating with other Negeri Sembilan orphanages

Our Activities carried out

We are a team of persons from different walks of life dedicated our efforts for the uplift of the children of poor and under privileged lot in the society, We initially concentrate on the Home, Food, Cloths, educational and welfare side of the group of children chosen for rehabilitation.

- Teaching, counseling and upbringing of children to make them responsible and productive citizens of Malaysia
- Providing and facilitating the education and training of these children in order to equip them with life skills
- Establishing foster homes for those children who are homeless, currently we have been forced to rent out home for these children during holiday time as they have nowhere else to go
- To provide / facilitate health care for the orphans
- By establishing projects and activities that generate income for the benefits from the sponsorship for the child Sponsorship for School fees and other educational requirements
- Medical care, clothing and subsistence allowance.

Organization management

The executive board controls the organization. But the supreme authority of the organization is the Founder/Chairman of the organization.

Participation of local people

The Board of Trustees of the Trust meets once in a year and plans for financial year goals and budget and implementation. The board will keep available this evaluation report and annual report to the entire general body members at the time of annual general body meeting for the open and transparency of the organization.

There are no local people involved in the project in helping us to help the orphans. The support of grains comes from one particular family once in every four months for the children in the orphanage. There may be support in the future from the local people but not to the extent of fulfilling the project. There are some voluntary organizations that can help us in giving clothes and basic necessities to the children.

The project is charitable in nature. This project is maintained by a Christian organization and therefore it is Christian by nature. But the main objective of the organization is to provide basic needs to all the children without any discrimination of caste, creed, class, or race.

MONITORING, REPORTING AND EVALUATION

The board of trustees and the staff are responsible for the monitoring and reporting of the projects. Staff would produce a narrative report about the project. Evaluation of the performance would be done once a year.
