





7-YEAR CIRCULATION TRENDS






PRL saw a 3% increase in circulation of library materials from FY23-FY24. Circulation has continued to rise steadily since the end of pandemic restrictions and is now exceeding pre-pandemic circulation figures.

Digital circulations saw a 16% increase from FY23 to FY24.

7-YEAR PROGRAMMING AVERAGE ATTENDANCE TRENDS





New state statistical reporting requirements have introduced a General Interest category for FY24, bringing together a diverse range of age groups for multi-generational programming. This new category presents an opportunity for growth and community engagement. We've observed a slight decline in average attendance numbers for all age groups due in part to the closing of the King and Queen Branch. Storytime programs experienced an increase in average attendance.

We're optimistic about the potential of the General Interest programs to attract even more participants in the future!

West Point Branch Relocated






On Saturday, May 4th, the West Point welcomed visitors into its newly renovated space.

Youth Programming

Early Literacy

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten moved to our new Beanstack platform this year. Since starting the program on Beanstack in May, we have had 424 participants sign up for the program.

Books 4 Babies offers parents and caregivers of children under the age of one to pick up a free book for their child at any of our locations. PRL provided 234 books in FY24.

PRL hosts 20 **storytimes** per week throughout all 9 branches.

In partnership with Hanover Parks and Recreation, Hanover Branch Library held an afterhours **Junior Detectives** program. Participants explored the library and participated in mystery solving activities.

Tiny Road Trip at the Ashland Branch Library was a zooming success! Children were invited to decorate a large box to then travel around the world. Kids were pushed in their box cars to each stop where they then watched a short video provided through Just for Kids, one of PRL's free online databases.

A **Solar Eclipse** passed over our area on the afternoon of April 8th, 2024. Every branch in our system hosted a celebration for this momentous event! People came to enjoy activities and crafts during the eclipse and we handed out 2,000 glasses to the public over the span of 2 days. It was a great success!

Young Adult

Teen Advisory Boards were established in the fall of 2022 at the Ashland, Atlee, and Mechanicsville Branches. Once a month, members of the board meet to discuss how the library can support teens and to provide ideas for teen programming.

Teen Hangout, at the Mechanicsville Branch Library, provides a space for teens to gather together after school. Teens can play board games, do their homework, and chat with a librarian. Throughout the month of October 2023, 290 teens attended teen hangout.
