Introduction & Background

Background

- On Jul 8, 2024, after a closed session, KW Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to withdraw from Pamunkey Regional Library (PRL) System by Jul 1st, 2025.
 - Primary justification was cost savings.
- Save the KW Libraries Website started, and petition circulated
 - Over 750 signatures obtained
- Citizens mobilized, spoke out at Board of Supervisor Meetings
- On Sep 23rd, 2024, the KW Board of Supervisors rescinded their withdrawal vote
 - Assigned negotiations to new County Administrator
 - Assigned deadline of 31 Dec 2024.
 - If "good faith negotiations" fail by deadline, KW's resolution to leave PRL will become effective 01 JAN 2025.
 - Final withdrawal from PRL would be effective 01 JAN 2027.

Background

- Since proclamation on Sep 23rd, County Administrator reported two separate face-to-face negotiations with County Administrators for Goochland and Hanover Counties.
- Town of West Point Administrator has not been consulted
- No updates provided on the progress of negotiations
- Major concern items (e.g. cost, contract length, withdrawal procedures, etc.) are unknown to the community
- Dec 9th, 2024 is the last Board of Supervisors meeting before the deadline o Last opportunity for citizens to provide the Board of Supervisors their input

What We DON'T Know

- What potential cost savings KW Board of Supervisors believe an independent library might bring to the county
 - No alternate budget plan has been presented
 - Current budget expenditures (\$603K) represents 2% of county budget.
- What resources and services a potential independent county library will provide
 - The Board has not indicated what (if any) services might be cut
 - The Board has committed to maintain existing services, but it is unclear if this is based on the current (reduced) library hours.

Relevant Code Sections

- § 42.1-33. Power of local governments to establish and support libraries. (1970)
- § 42.1-34. Power of local governments to contract for library service.
- § 42.1-37. Establishment of regional library system.
- § 42.1-38. Agreements to create regional boards.
- § 42.1-39,40. Regional library boards generally; Power of regional library boards
- § 42.1-41. Funds and expenses of regional library system.
- § 42.1-42. Withdrawal from regional library system.
- § 42.1-46. Library policy of the Commonwealth.
- § 42.1-47. Grants for development of library service.

Code Section for State Aid Allocation

§ 42.1-48. Grants to improve standards.

Local effort: 40% of every [local] dollar expended by the political subdivision(s) in the system. The grant to any county or city shall not exceed \$250,000.

PLUS

Per capita: Based on population of area served and number of participating municipalities

- 30 cents for the first 600,000 persons served (county or city library) plus 10 cents per capita for each additional jurisdiction (regional)
- Libraries serving in excess of 600,000 receive 10 cents per capita for remaining population

PLUS

Square mileage: \$10 per square mile for single jurisdiction (county or city) libraries plus an additional \$20 per square mile for libraries serving more than one political jurisdiction (regional).

Relevant Virginia Administrative Code Section: 17VAC15-110-10

- Have local operating expenditures of at least 50% of the median ...which must be from taxation or endowment.
- Libraries obtaining aid for the first time or those falling below the 50% median must meet the requirement within 5 years. Libraries which fall below 50% ...must submit a plan to the State Library Board for reaching the minimum requirement.

 The plan must include a schedule of annual increases in local expenditures of not less than 20% of the amount needed to attain local per capita expenditures ...within five years. Local operating expenditures ...shall not fall below that of the previous year.

Relevant Virginia Administrative Code Section: 17VAC15-110-10

- County-wide cuts may be excused but may not be aimed specifically at the library...state aid would be proportionately reduced.
- Library specific cuts would eliminate all state aid funds.

- Libraries that become ineligible for state aid become ineligible to received federal funds or assets acquired with federal funds.
- State aid may be reinstated as such time as the locality meets the median expenditure.

Possible Solution to Benefit All Parties

- Multiple residents from each of the county's district prepared a proposal that would allow the Board to reduce the financial contribution King William has to make to PRL and allows us to retain access to resources
- Moving the UKW Library to a county-owned building would eliminate the \$33,000 they provide to rent and maintain the current location.
- This \$33,000 is included in the county's contribution to PRL, so eliminating this rent reduces overall costs for library services.
