## *From the President Desk*

Being part of a paleontology club, I get a lot of requests to crochet unusual dinosaurs. You're just never going to find Nothronychus or Microraptor plushies from commercial vendors, and everyone should get a chance to snuggle their favorite prehistoric megafauna! The obscurity of these dinosaurs means there usually isn't a written crochet pattern out there already, and so in support of my friends' obsessions, I set out to make one up myself.

My most recent subject was *Ornatops incantatus*, a type of "duck-billed" hadrosaur that lived in New Mexico 80 million years ago.





The first thing I do when trying to crochet a new dinosaur is to determine what makes it stand out from other, similar dinosaurs. The features that will make my friend say "That's it! That's my favorite guy!" In this case, it's the little frill on its face that it's named after- Ornatops means "ornate face."

My next step is to figure out the body shape. This was a challenge for Ornatops, since the only visual reference I had to work with was the above drawing of its head. After reading through some journal articles, I learned that Ornatops

is known from a partial skeleton, of which we mostly have skull material, so I would have to figure out a close-enough body plan based on its closest relatives.

Ornatops was a hadrosaur, which is a family of plant-eating dinosaurs that generally had small heads, large hind legs, and smaller front legs that they could use for walking or for pulling branches down from trees. It's also closely related to Maiasaura, the "good mother dinosaur," of which we have a more complete fossil record! Given the close family relationship, I figured the Maiasaura was a good basis for the Ornatops body shape. It's also very similar to a crochet pattern I've used before, this Iguanodon (another member of the hadrosaur family).

Since I was able to rely on this pattern for the general shape, all I had to do was alter it to get the crucial details right. The crest was easy to figure out from the reference photo, but when I got to the legs, I had to think. The kind of person who chooses Ornatops as their favorite dinosaur is the kind of person who would care deeply about how many toes Ornatops had on each foot, and the Iguanodon pattern may not be quite right. After texting a paleontologist friend the very normal question "Hey, do you know how many toes Ornatops had?" I opted to model it after the Maiasaura: Hind feet with three splayed toes, and more vertical, hoof-like forefeet.



*Ornatops incantatus* was a great hit at Christmas! It has a new home on display in my friend's office, she's very happy with her new hadrosaur buddy, and I am eagerly anticipating the next obscure prehistoric creature request.

Traveling teacher:


