
Please bring checks or cash, especially for the Silent Auction, as we do NOT have credit card access.

Card Weaving Workshop - October 25th

At the end of October, Winnie Johnson from the Telarana Guild gave a workshop on Card Weaving (also called tablet weaving) to 8 of our Guild members. It was a great beginning exploration of card weaving and learning how to thread the cards and create patterns. As we learned, there are many ways to tension the warp including inkle looms, rigid heddle looms, and C clamps on boards and using a back strap. These projects are very portable!

Winnie brought many examples of her card weaving projects and books and other resources for us to look at. Some of the workshop participants finished their card woven sample and even completed another one and brought those to our November meeting.

We hope to offer this workshop again, depending on interest.
