
From the President's desk...

VOLUNTEER WEAVING TEACHER NEEDED!

I need to retire from my weaving class at the AZ Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Description: warp looms, teach students to weave, check as they weave and fix mistakes, finish projects [twist fringes, sewing, etc.]. The projects are basic tabby weave – placemats, table runners, area rugs, stoles, tote bags. I am available to help a new teacher get adjusted. There are 2 floor looms and 2 table looms.

Time: Tuesday mornings from 10am – 11:30am, but the day and time could be changed. The time needed in addition to the class time to keep the looms warped and projects finished is considerable. Although this is a big time commitment, it is very rewarding. Most of the students have some sight, but even the few who are totally blind are able to feel what they are doing.

Location: 32nd Street and Roosevelt.
