From the President's desk...

As some of you may know, I'm not only your president and newsletter editor, I'm also on the board of the Arizona Federation of Spinners and Weavers Guilds.

The Federation used to organize a biennial multi-day fiber arts conference called "Fibers Through Time" or FTT. For various reasons (too long for this page) we no longer do the conference. In 2016, we organized Federation Day instead, a day for guild members to come together, mingle and participate in seminars or make-and-take workshops, have lunch (with keynote speaker) and do a little shopping. Federation Day 2016 was a success, so we thought about what to do next.

Instead of a conference with multiple 2.5-day workshops we decided to bring in one nationally renowned "traveling teacher" to Arizona in February 2018. The Federation would cover their air fare and all of the member guilds would have an opportunity to host the teacher for a 2- or 3-day workshop. Our first traveling teacher is Rosalie Neilson and she is also going to be the keynote speaker at Federation Day 2018.

Federation Day 2018 is going to be different than the last one in 2016. Back then, attendees were offered a single package - one price included the luncheon with keynote speaker and one seminar or make-and-take workshop, which were about only about one hour long. The "teachers" were volunteers.

In 2018 we'll offer half-day and full-day workshops, but they are not included with the luncheon. Instead the offering is "a la carte": attendees can decide whether they would like to attend the luncheon only or the luncheon and workshops - they are all priced separately (and this time the teachers are paid as well). Alternatively, one could attend Federation Day and just mingle without paying for anything. Guild exhibits, vendors, and raffle are open to the public. However, if you are interested in the luncheon and workshops, registration is expected to open late October or beginning of November.

My heartfelt thanks go to our guild members who are volunteering for Federation Day. Michelle Mattingly is working on the registration brochure and Deanna Ikeya is the hospitality chair, Christine Hunt will be running the raffle, and Sara Jenkins is going to organize our guild table. Michelle Mattingly and Ruth Greenspan are both teaching classes. You all are making me proud! I am hoping that a few more guild members will step up to volunteer on the event day itself, to help with hospitality, and staffing the the raffle as well as our guild table. Also, we're hoping to present some nice raffle prizes in the name of our guild. Please let Christine or me know if you are interested in volunteering or donating.
