# AZ FIBER FESTIVAL CAMP VERDE, AZ APRIL 5-7 2024

The AZ Federation of Weavers and Spinners Guilds (The Federation) is planning the AZ Fiber Festival in Camp Verde, AZ on April 5-7, 2024. If you would like to be involved in planning the event or during the event, email <a href="mailto:volunteers@azfed.org">volunteers@azfed.org</a>. Day of volunteer shifts will be between 2 and 4 hours so you can both take a class and volunteer.

Twenty-five half-day to full day fiber workshops will be offered ranging from weaving to spinning, felting, kumihimo and knitting. Fifteen of these classes are geared to beginners with no experience necessary. Registration begins Nov 5. There will also be a vendor hall with fiber related items for sale, and raffle baskets. Demonstrations will be scheduled in the vendor hall periodically during the event. More info will be coming.

The Federation has asked each Guild to have a booth with demonstrators. Guild members are welcome to sell their items at the Guild booth if they have the proper tax licenses. Each Guild is also expected to provide a raffle basket worth about \$200. Beki Welsch and Ruth Greenspan will be collecting items you would like to donate toward the Guild's raffle basket. You can bring your donations to Guild meetings up until the March 2024 meeting.
