California Agricultural Aircraft Association Code of Ethics

Article I Purpose

It is the purpose of this Code of Ethics to establish professional standards that will enhance the professionalism of the Aerial Application Industry. The CAAA membership encourages all California Agricultural Application Operators to join and adhere to these professional standards. CAAA members subscribing to these professional standards will foster a professional attitude toward the industry while promoting the safety of people and the protection of the environment.

Article II Professional Standards

- A. *Professional Standards Manual*: All CAAA members shall provide to all employees this manual of good operating practices and professional standards.
- B. *Operations:* All CAAA members shall conduct all operations in accordance to all appropriate governmental regulations while exercising good judgment during all applications.
- C. *Employees*: All CAAA members shall provide Work, Safety and Pesticide Training to all employees to ensure safety and promote a professional working atmosphere. Pilots are qualified applicators with sufficient information and environmental concerns to perform all applications with a high degree of safety.
- D. *Maintenance:* All CAAA members shall have maintenance performed in accordance with all appropriate regulations.
- E. *Equipment:* All CAAA members shall use good judgment in the use of members' equipment to ensure the safety of people and protection of the environment.

Article III Insurance

A. All CAAA members shall have insurance as required by the State of California.

Article IV Business Standards

A. CAAA members shall maintain business standards that match the high technical requirements of their industry. While recognizing it is impossible to enumerate all the attitudes and factors that comprise good business ethics, operators recognize certain areas in which positive principles do apply, which includes financial, salesmanship and maintenance of integrity in the Industry.

Article V Implementation

A. The CAAA members are committed to the professionalism and future of the Aerial Application Industry. Adhering to the Code of Ethics will assist the California Agricultural Pesticide Operators to maintain a high degree of professionalism, promote a safe working place and protect the environment.

When a person, partnership, corporation, association or other business entity applies for membership in CAAA, it is assumed that adoption of the association's professional standards and objectives are both implied and exist.

CAAA MEMBER CATEGORIES

Owner-Operator Member:	Limited to persons, firms, co-partnerships, corporations or associations that own and operate agricultural aircraft as a pest control operation.
Pilot Member:	Persons who are California certified pilots or apprentice pilots of agricultural aircraft.
Sustaining Member:	Farms, operators of firms in production agriculture other than agricultural aviation and operators of businesses engaged in agricultural aviation activities who are non-residents of the State of California.
Allied Industry Member:	Individuals or firms who are interested in the development and promotion of agricultural equipment and aircraft; and manufacturers of products used in agriculture.
Associate Member:	Individuals that do not fit in the above categories, but have an interest in the Agricultural Aviation Industry. This would include persons, who are employed in agricultural operations, hold a qualified applicator certificate but do not qualify as a pilot member.
