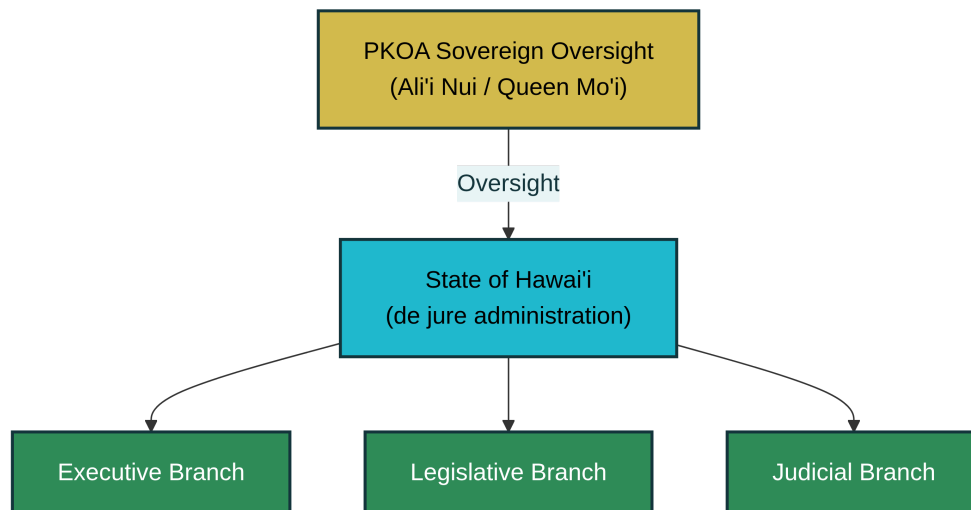
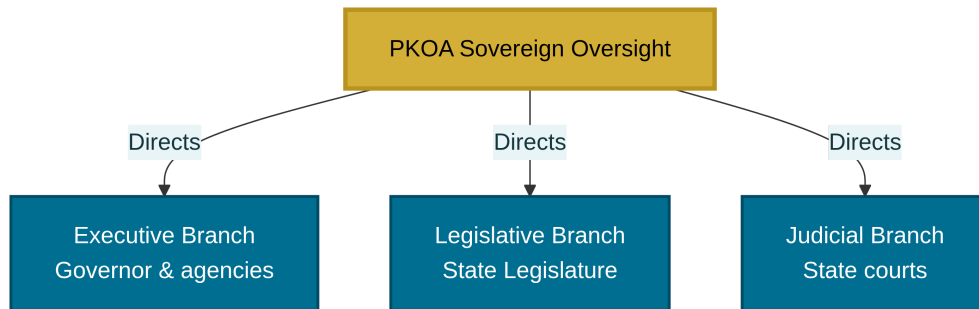


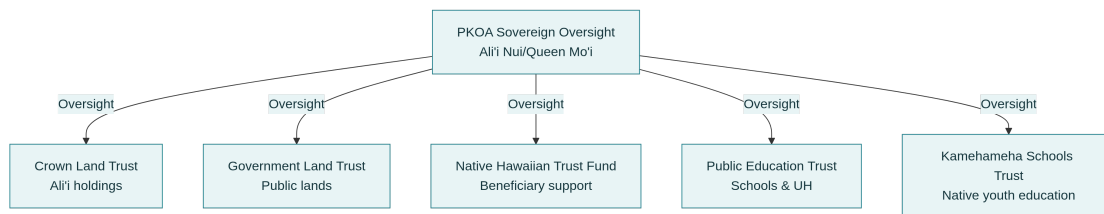

Simplified PKOA Oversight Flowchart of State of Hawaii



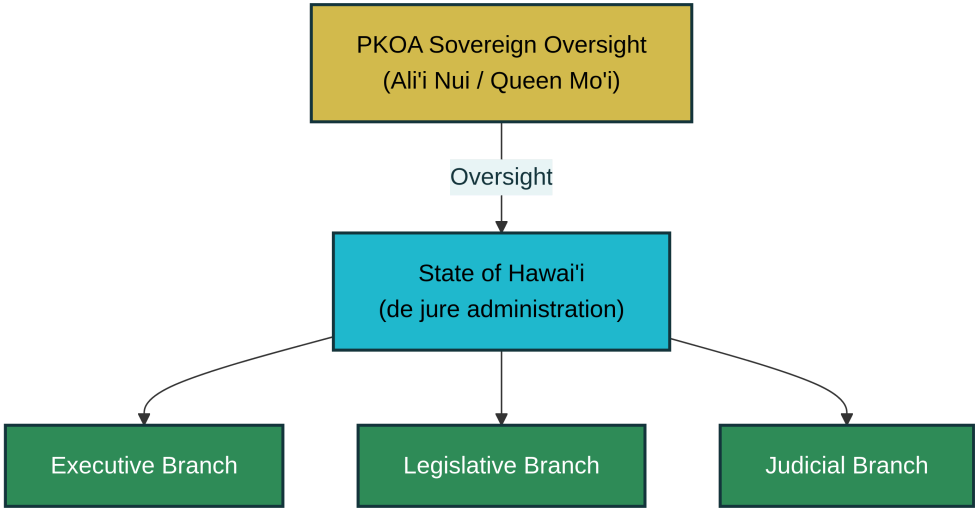
PKOA Government Branches Organizational Chart

Simplified Oversight Flowchart

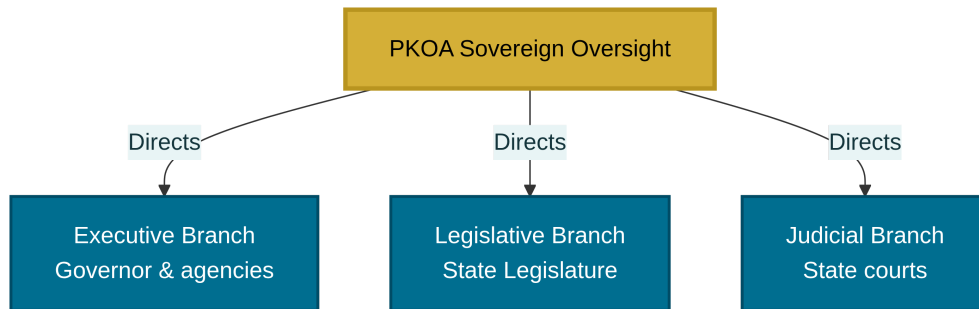
PKOA Sovereign Oversight flows directly to State of Hawai'i branches via oversight authority.

Government Branches Chart

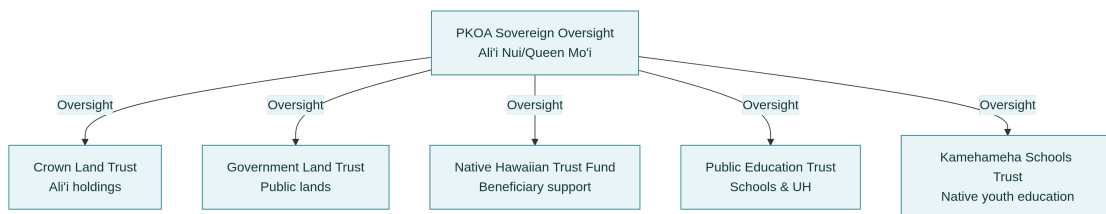
PKOA directs the three core government branches: Executive, Legislative, and Judicial.

Authority Lines Mapping

Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i holds apex authority over trustees via these direct lines:^[1]

Sovereign	→ Oversight →	Trustee/Branch
Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i	Crown Land Trustee (ali'i holdings) ^[3]	State DLNR agencies
Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i	Government Land Trustee (public lands) ^[1]	State land boards
Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i	Native Hawaiian Trustee (beneficiaries) ^[4]	OHA-like entities
Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i	Public Education Trustee (schools/UH) ^[1]	DOE leadership

Executive Summary

The Polynesian Kingdom of Atooi (PKOA) exercises de jure sovereign oversight over the State of Hawai'i—absorbed from the dissolved Hawaiian Kingdom—as its administrative apparatus, with Ali'i Nui/Queen Mo'i at the apex directing government branches and five crown trusts (Crown Land, Government Land, Native Hawaiian Fund, Public Education, Kamehameha Schools). This structure restores autonomy for Atooi/Kaua'i lands while integrating state functions under royal directives, emphasizing cultural and beneficiary priorities. Stakeholders should note U.S./UN views treat Hawai'i as a state, with PKOA claims advanced through activism and legal assertions. ^{[1] [2] [3] [5] [6]}
