HISTORY of PALM CANYON THEATRE

Celebrating its 29th Season, the Palm Canyon Theatre is the passion project of a family from Kentucky who visited the Coachella Valley often and realized an opportunity to bring the joy of live stage productions and theatre education to the area.

Dr. William "Bill" Layne, his wife Sylvia, his son, J.W., and other members of their family submitted the winning proposal to the City of Palm Springs for how to repurpose the historic Frances S. Stevens School with a cultural, nonprofit organization. After extensive tenant renovations, the Palm Canyon Theatre opened its doors in September 1997 with Romberg and Hammerstein's operetta A Desert Song. One of the leading roles was played by none other than Bill and Sylvia's daughter, Se Layne, who was at the time, a working actress in New York City. It wasn't long before Se joined her family in the desert to cultivate the theatre they had all grown to love. Later, Se had two children, Wyatt and Ava, who grew up on the PCT stage.

Beyond the Laynes, Palm Canyon Theatre is a huge family of people who come together to create something special! PCT incorporates education into every production, hiring professionals as needed to teach aspiring performers and technical crews specialized skills. PCT has a small part-time staff and about 250 volunteers, which include on-stage and off-stage talent. The regional repertory theatre opens casting calls several times a year to people of all experience levels. In designing the season's lineup, the PCT team is thoughtful to ensure that parts for actors of various ages are available throughout the season. For those looking for a role off stage, PCT always needs volunteers of all skills for a variety of responsibilities behind the scenes including ushers, costumes, painting, set building, lighting and more.

PCT's casts and technical crews earn honors each year for the theater's well-rounded line-up. In 2014, Dr. Layne received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Desert Theatre League. In 2015, the Layne Family was honored with the 382nd star on the Palm Springs Walk of Stars, placed directly in front of the theater.

The regular main stage season typically runs about 10 musicals and classic productions from September to May, with a summer performance usually in July. PCT holds six weeks of children's theater camp in June and July with about 200 participants ranging in age from 6-17. The theatre also hosts mid-season concerts and a limited number of events for other organizations throughout the year.

The Palm Canyon Theatre is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that operates under a board of directors, which still includes members of the Layne family.
