#### WHAT DOES AN UP & COMING VARMINT CALLER DO DURING THE OFF-SEASON??? by Eddie M.

Well it is that time of year again. The official Predator season is over. What are we to do? Well below is a list I've used before that doesn't really change too much. There is still plenty reason to get out, just doing different things.

Well the past predator calling season sure seemed to go by fast & just when you were really starting to see real results too! You had FUN & not just in learning the how-twos of the hunt. There was also the camaraderie with your hunt partners, sharing the outdoor adventure/experience together. The campfire at night, waking up in the mornings, the beautiful landscapes and sharing the success/failures! Now they say that the season is over! What Are You Going To Do!

- \* Well one of the things that many of us do NOT do is to keep on hunting coyotes. Even though the season is year-round in Arizona and should be, most of us quit hunting them in late spring/summer (by choice) & let them raise their pups. This ensures that there will be more coyotes in the fall. That is not to say that we won't still pull the trigger on one. If someone (say the Indian Reservations or AZ. Game & Fish; antelope country) invites us on a hunt because they're having problems or one is called in on a spring turkey hunt, well what happens, happens, overall though most of us give the coyote a break. The other predators do have seasons so there is no need to discuss them.
- \* Finding elk & deer antlers are not only fun but can also be profitable. On the spring turkey hunt in New Mexico in 2014, we had some people pull up in their horse trailer, saddle the horses & go riding to look for elk antlers. The top guy said that they had made about \$4000 so far that year. Every year probably 99.8% of the elk & deer males drop their old antlers & grow a set of new ones. The brown (recent drops) antlers can be worth anywhere from \$9 to \$14 per pound depending upon the market! That means that just one big brown elk antler can bring \$80 or more! The white antlers (1 year or older) also have a price. I myself just enjoy finding them. It's hard for me to part with them even for a price.
- \* Hunting the Spring Wild Turkey Gobbler is another passion that afflicts many. One reason is that you are still calling & trying to fool an elusive critter to you with the added bonus that gobblers are often quite vocal/loud when coming to your calling. The closer they get the louder! Normally when a gobbler gobbles, the hens come to him. You must reverse nature to get a gobbler to come to you! The action can be very, very exciting! I tell the up & coming new turkey hunters, if you are going to become a turkey hunter free yourself of all responsibilities during the months of April & May. No birthdays, no anniversaries, no weddings. Plan your life that way as otherwise you will only create problems for yourself!
- \* Attend the PVCI Club Activities. During the fall & winter months a lot of us members are busy hunting however when the hunting seasons are over the Phoenix Varmint Callers like to plan family-oriented events. For instance, the June 5th (Free Fishing Day) PVCI Fishing Contest where all Members & Guests participate in a Raffle, the August PVCI Trail Clearing & August Varmint Calling Boot Camp. are all PVCI family-oriented Events where the members are encouraged to bring families & friends. In doing this we ALL get to meet each other, perhaps share a meal or two, share in friendly competition and do work together (Trail Clearing). Once the wife & family get to know some of the folks you may be hunting with it may make it a little easier to get away come hunting season. Also, you will get to know the other callers that participate better. You see them, they see you (it is called exposure), you interact & come hunting season who knows? Anytime you get around a fire at night like the Fishing Contest or Trail Clearing, if you keep your ears open, you run the risk that you might learn things. Invariably there will be hunting stories told, hunting tips given out on what methods worked for this or that, hunting questions answered, etc.

In addition, there are some other Events that many **PVCI** members also attend each of which is also family oriented. Many events may be canceled **The Payson Wildlife Fair**, **July Arizona Trappers Assoc./Convention w/ Miss Rodeo Arizona** helping, and the September **Southwest Fur Harvesters Rendezvous** are GREAT places to hear the above kind of talk. Of course, you will also hear instructional calling/hunting/trapping seminars at all 3 of these Events. Keep an eye on the Calendar of Events in this Predator Tales for the dates of these upcoming Events. Check out their web sites before going.

\* What about going fishing? Arizona does have some really great fishing for both warm & cold-water species. There are a few lakes, rivers, creeks & even canals (towards Yuma) and waterholes (Indian Reservations) where fish can be caught. Also, do not forget the Urban Lakes here in town. You no longer need an Urban Fishing License as it's included in the price of a Regular Yearly Fishing or Combo Hunt/Fish License now. P.S. None of this applies of course if you have ever fished for Steelhead in your past pre-Arizona life. Almost everyone I have ever met who has done this appears to be SPOILED ROTTEN and in most cases do not want to fish for anything else. It almost seems like they need to go to a Steelhead Self-Recovery Help Group to get over the fun they had. Most certainly the comments & actions that I have observed have made me very leery about ever fishing for that kind of fish. \* Do not forget to stay practiced up in your shooting at the Range. Also, now is an excellent time for inspecting the gear that you do have & preparing your gear for next year. Another PLUS of our Family-Oriented Events competition is that These Events are designed to help keep your competitive spirit in tune & keep you practiced during the off-season.


# Rock Island Armory – 22 TCM (FS) Product Review by Wayne W. https://www.armscor.com/firearms/ria/tcm-series/


If you've ever seen a 22 TCM, it kind of makes you wonder. what were these guys smoking when they created this thing? A 22-caliber pistol in a 1911 format that will shoot a 39gr hollow point at 2,000+ fps out of a 5 barrel? This I had to see.

Many of you will know that I'm a pistol fanatic at heart but prefer a rifle for song dogs due to distance and need for terminal velocity and energy transfer. When I first heard of the 22 TCM I was intrigued to say the least.

I was able to get my hands on the FS single stack model which came with both a 22 TCM as well as a 9mm conversion barrel and spring. The single stack magazine holds 10 rounds, plus one up the pipe. (The double stack model holds 17+1). It shipped from the factory set with the TCM barrel, although the conversion to 9mm takes all of about 20 seconds once you've done it once or twice and the magazines are interchangeable with the 9mm!







When I pulled it out of the box the first thing that impressed me was the stippled polymer grip and smooth action of the gun. The adjustable rear sites and dovetail fiber optic front site made it easy to get on target and stay there.

A commonly compared neighbor to the 22 TCM is the 5.7x28, which runs about 2200 fps, (150-200 fps faster than the TCM) and has a greater variety of bullets. In my research, the TCM cost nearly a grand less, and (my opinion) was just a prettier sidearm due to my love for the 1911 format. Ammunition as of December was roughly \$27.99 for a box of 100 and readily available at almost any Cal-Ranch store where the 5.7x28 was roughly 2-3 times that – if you can find it.

The 5.7 is touted as more of a law enforcement round, due to its ability to penetrate body armor, but I don't need that, (though likely still possible) for my quarry is more into speed and stealth than body armor. I was able to test the TCM on some 2" hardened steel, and can safely say if I see a varmint behind that much steel, he's pretty safe anyway.

Shooting impressions and accuracy: If you love a buttery smooth trigger and almost no recoil, with a pistol that probably already fits in a holster you already own, you're going to like this gun! The gun functioned flawlessly through the first couple hundred rounds without a single malfunction. Accuracy is excellent, and if you get a chance to shoot it in the evening, the 4 foot flame that comes out the barrel is quite impressive. And all with almost no recoil! I've taken two coyotes with this round so far, and have to say, within typical pistol ranges, this thing really packs a punch!

Long Term: I have to say this pistol is not likely to go anywhere soon and has a permanent place with my hunting gear. With the available ammo, and now the reloading components being more readily available from Armscor, this heavy hitting, fire breathing dragon is a keeper!

#### **PVCI'S Trailer**

What started out as an offer to help fix the flat tire on the Club Trailer ended up taking a lot of time and help!

As the case progressed, I made a trip to Wayne's to check out the conditions and found that Ricardo G. had taken the trailer to his place to repair the electrical problems and the flat tire. Sounds great, but when I did get to investigate the



trailer, I quickly understood why Wayne was say that we should get rid of it. It was impossible to determine what was stored in the trailer. It looked like everything had been piled in with little thought. I had never witnessed the trailer in use, so I had no idea of how it was used or what it carried. I spent several trips to the trailer to take pictures and measurements of items I could see then I searched the web to find



similar items and determine their sizes. I just wanted to provide a plan on how to load the trailer better. But the best laid plans often go astray. Wayne called me & asked me to attend the monthly board meeting & explain what I found. I had a short Power point presentation half completed that I took with me. As luck would have it Steve L. was, they and he offered to help weld the table storage frame that I had been designing. I was asked to provide an estimate for the cost of the modes. Which at the time was a WAG as I had

not purchased wood or fasteners for an awfully long time. I estimated it would come in at about \$450.00. My total spent was \$439.49 Talk about being close. Well, I bought the pipe for the table frame at a savings because Steve told me about them. I had them cut the pipe to lengths I cleaned them for welding and Steve L. welded it up.

What a great Job Steve!!! He even primed the welds for painting. I then spent a day





emptying the trailer and painting the table storage rack. I found a lot of odds and loose ends in the trailer. Including all the material needed to mount the propane bottles on the front of the trailer tongue. I used 1x4 lumber along the sides of the trailer to protect them, and I built a shelf in the front of the trailer to hold miscellaneous items. I mounted the table storage rack to the left rear of the trailer next. Then I located the two stoves along the left wall and made a table above them while still providing access. Cots and tents were loaded above the tables I hung chairs above the canopy storage box in the front of the trailer. I obtained an inventor list from Ron H. that listed a few missing items, so I donate a trailer jack, a small cook stove, two keyed the same master locks, a fire extinguisher, and a fly swatter. There are more items on the list that are wanted so please help. The cots, tents and chairs that are provided for the disabled
