



The PVCI Officers & Board Members are the decision making core of PVCI & besides the duties that each position represents, they are also required to attend one extra Meeting on the third Wednesday of each month. There is a certain amount of prestige associated with being a Phoenix Varmint Caller Officer or Board Member & you will go down in history as having been elected. The PVCI Presidents especially not only have a place in history but there can also be some FAME that goes along with the position. This is after all a fine Club that is known for Conservation & Education. If you would like to nominate someone to be elected to this "Special Group" please do so when the nominations are opened at the next few Club Meetings.

President: Responsible for running both the regular club meeting & the Board of Directors meeting & shall direct the activities of this Club.

Vice-President: Assist the President in running meetings & business, also in charge if the President is absent.

Corresponding Secretary: Responsible for all club correspondence with the outside, the press, the other clubs, etc. He shall keep a complete file of this correspondence. 
Recording Secretary: Accurately records all club minutes at both the regular & board meetings. These minutes contain among other things, the type of meeting, date & place & time of the meeting, a list of the officers and directors present plus any motions or amendments. Keeps this record in a safe place and is able to furnish past minutes if needed.

Treasurer: Receives all dues and other funds coming into this club then deposits them to this club's account immediately upon receipt. Keeps accurate records of all receipts and disbursements and is able to render an annual financial statement. Also prepares a monthly report that is entered into the club's minutes during the meetings. The Treasurer keeps the Club's checkbook and he/she pays all the bills incurred by the Club including rent, trophies, locker, mailbox, etc. and responsible for the club's non-profit status & records. The President, Vice-President and Treasurer shall be authorized to sign checks, two (2) signatures being required.

Board of Director Member(s): Must be able to attend two (2) meetings per month, the regular and the board meeting. Votes on issues discussed at board meetings. Also helps in planning and organizing club events, helps decide on the direction of the club and usually chairs at least one committee for the major club events.

The Tail of Two Javelina

A few years back the AZGFD changed the annual harvest limit on javelina from one per calendar year to two per calendar year. You have to apply for your first tag through the draw. Then you can get a leftover tag or an over-the-counter tag. The over-the-counter tag is only open in five units. These units have low density of javelina or the units have access issues due to private property. Now some people will say that javelina smell bad and taste even worse. Well, I agree. They do smell bad, but if you have them made into sausage, they taste pretty good.



This year fellow member Nick D. and I got drawn for a general hunt in unit 20C. I have successfully hunted this unit for three years straight. Now I'm going for four. Opening morning has come. Along with it was half an inch of rain from the night before. Roads were muddy. Temperatures were cold. The side by side was in four-wheel drive. It was time to hunt. We hiked to the first glassing spot. After two hours of nothing, it was time to move on. The second spot wasn't any better. Time for the third glassing location. As we reached the third area, I was getting ready to park and just like it was waiting for us, there was a javelina standing just off the trail. I parked the side by side. Nick grabbed his rifle, while I grabbed my .41 mag. revolver. I maneuvered over to a couple of bushes. Peeked over the top of them, and the javelina was standing right there. I had a broadside shot at fifteen yards. The 210gr XTP did its job with one round. The javelina didn't even take a step. It swayed back and forth and tipped over. Nick took to the high ground in search of another javelina. None were in sight. I had taken a 40lb boar with one shot thru the heart. We

went back to camp, ate lunch, then got the meat in the cooler. We hunted till Saturday evening and couldn't find another javelina for Nick. With more rain and/or snow on its way we went home.

Fast forward to the next weekend. It's time for the March monthly hunt. Nick and I teamed up for the weekend. We

decided to go calling in the units that were open for the over-the-counter hunt in case we saw javelina. Saturday was a good day. We got three coyotes that day. With sundown approaching, we agreed to spend the "Golden Hour" looking for javelina. I have taken fifteen javelina out of this area over the last seventeen years, so I had a good idea where to go. We drove and glassed, drove and glassed. As we came around a corner there were ten javelina right in front of us. It felt just like the previous weekend. As if the javelina were waiting for us to show up. They didn't wait around. Once again Nick grabbed his rifle while I grabbed mine. I waited for Nick to shoot first, then put two rounds into my target. Nick got two rounds into his target also. Two javelina down. Now we got some work to do. My javelina was a 58lb boar while Nick's was a 54lb sow. By the time we got done with the javelina, got cleaned up, ate dinner, set up our tents and got to bed, it was after 11PM. We made three more stands the next morning resulting in one more coyote. Great weekend. Time to go home.



I take my javelina to Sanchez Wild Game Processing. I've been using them for eight years now and have no complaints. There you can turn your javelina into chorizo, breakfast sausage, green chili breakfast sausage, or Italian sausage. All of the flavors taste great. I'm going to end up with 43lbs of sausage. Burrito time!! Not only do you get to go big game hunting for two javelina, but they can be good to eat.

Product Review of Sig Sauer P320 Xcarry Legion 9mm with a Riton MPRD 2 red dot


This firearm is typically not one I would own, but I managed to acquire it and wanted to see what the hype was all about. I have to say, typically, my everyday carry was either a Beretta 92FS or a Springfield XD both in 9mm, and now it is my Sig. While I was skeptical of the firearm at first after shooting it, I was sold on Sig Sauer. At 2.5lbs, it is a little heavier than what I am used to, but I adjusted to that quickly. The barrel length, including a pre-threaded barrel for a muz-break or suppressor, is 4.6in, so it is a little long but still shorter than some others I have carried. It came with one 17-round mag, making it equal to my other everyday carries. Adding the Riton red dot was so easy and simple, and it fits perfectly with this pistol. The action on this pistol is so smooth, with a light trigger pull, much lighter than my others, and the reduced recoil, this became my new favorite for those facts alone. Lastly, one of my favorite features of this firearm is the extended magwell, allowing for fast and easy reloading. This added feature made it where I could quickly drop an empty mag and reload with only a glance at the firearm. My only criticism of this firearm is how difficult it was to find a holster that fit, and i ended up buying Sig Sauer's holster specifically designed for the P320 Xcarry Legion, spending a bit more than I would have liked. Overall, I give this pistol a 9 out of 10 for performance and comfortability and a 7 out of 10 for its weight and overall length.














