HOUSEHOLD EMPLOYEE

Household employee definition: If you work for someone at their home and he/she controls what work is done, how you did the work; and, you made less than \$1900 per household and you did not have to purchase any expenses, you are considered a household worker and not self-employed.

*Some examples of workers who do household work are: Babysitters, Caretaker, Cleaning people, Domestic workers, Drivers, Health Aides, Housekeepers, Groundkeepers, Maids, Nannies, Private Nurses, Yard Workers, etc.

If any person you worked for paid you \$1900 or more for the entire year you must provide tax preparer with a w2, but if you worked for multiple people and they paid you less than \$1900, please give us the total amount you were paid from all employers that year combined.
