





## In Wisconsin schools:



2.3x

White students are 2.3 times as likely to be enrolled in at least one AP class as Black students



Discipline

**7.5**x

Black students are 7.5 times as likely to be suspended as White students

## How Americans tend to think about racial disparities



Failure of willpower:
The assumption that
problems are due, at
some level, to personal
failings.



Cultural Pathology. The assumption that racial disparities today are due to cultural failings such as misguided values and poor choices.



Fatalism. The assumption that inequities are inevitable, and that racial disparities in particular cannot be solved.

## Intentional framing: focus on shared values

All children deserve a fair and just opportunity for a high-quality education.

Education is a strong predictor of long-term health and quality of life.

To live up to the ideal of justice for all, we must tackle unequal educational conditions and barriers to high-quality education that affect some people more than others.

## Explore underlying issues: public school funding depends on property taxes

White school districts receive more funding on average than nonwhite districts. In the US, the average nonwhite school district receives \$2,226 less per student than a white school district.
