MONOLOGUE 4: SIMON STIMSON (Act III – Cemetery Reflection)

Suggested Roles:

- Simon Stimson
- Ensemble outsiders
- Characters with emotional depth, bitterness, or detachment

About This Monologue: From beyond the grave, Simon delivers a haunting reflection on how the living fail to understand the beauty and fragility of life. This is a brief, intense moment of bitterness and sorrow. Use this monologue if you are drawn to emotionally complex or darker roles.

Tips:

- Speak simply, and let the weight of the words speak for themselves.
- Don't force intensity—let quietness carry the pain.
- Approach this with the confidence of someone who feels deeply and is no longer afraid to express it.
