Use this monologue to show vulnerability, emotional accessibility, and the ability to speak plainly from the heart.

Tips:

- Let the fear come from love, not just nerves.
- Don't rush—let silence or hesitation reveal meaning.
- Keep the emotion grounded in truth, not theatricality.

EMILY: I never felt so alone in my whole life. And George over there, looking so! I hate him. I wish I were dead. Papa! Papa! I don't want to get married! Why can't I stay for a while just as I am? Let's go away - don't you remember what you used to say? All the time you used to say - all the time: that I was *your* girl! There must be lots of places we can go to. I'll work for you. I could keep house. If you love me, help me. All I want is for someone to love me. And I mean for-ever. Did you hear? Forever and ever.
