## 'Thin Places' offer divine glimpse

My wife Terrie and I have been taking Spiritual Direction Training with the Alabama-West Florida Conference at Blue Lake Camp. We read books in between sessions; and go to Blue Lake once a quarter for 4 days of study, group time, and solitude. We've enjoyed it – for the most part. I have been convicted of some of my short fallings and stretched in some directions that I resisted, but I am so glad we have entered into

At our last training in January, we studied the Desert Fathers and Mothers, Celtic Spirituality, and the Spirituality of the Twelve Steps. As one who loves history of any kind but particularly church history, I really enjoy the historical backgrounds presented in these classes.

One of the ideas we get from Celtic Spirituality is that of "Thin Places." An official definition of a "thin place" would be "locales where the distance between heaven and earth collapses

and we're able to catch glimpses of the divine." (J. Phillip Newell, <u>Listening to the Heartbeat of God</u>) The distance between heaven and earth collapses and we experience God more intimately. For the ancient Celts, places like the wind-swept isle of Iona or the rocky peaks of Croagh Patrick were considered thin places.

Among my favorite pictures described in the Scriptures comes from the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptizer. Luke's Gospel says "...Jesus also was baptized; and while He prayed, the heaven was opened. And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him, and a voice came from heaven which said, 'You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased.'" (Luke 3:21b-22, NKJV) Wow! Now that's a thin place.

In the Upper Room Disciplines 2019, David Benedict tells us that the word for open used in Luke 3:21 is translated in the Hawaiin text as "weheia," which has a much wider range

of definition than our word open. It means open, untie, undo, loosen, unlock, and take off (as in clothes). So Benedict says this expands our thinking on what happened that day when Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River. The sky opened, became untied, undone. The sky let loose, was unlocked — or "Heaven became naked and exposed and the Holy Spirit was revealed." Again, now that's a thin place.

For me, Camp Sumatanga has always been a thin place.

From my first trip there the summer before I entered the fifth grade, through my last trip there in November 2018 for Alabama Emmaus Walk #481, I've experienced a fresh presence of the Holy Spirit in my life many times.

It's not part of my theology that God is closer in some places than others – I believe we can experience God wherever we are. However, I believe there are places we are more likely to encounter God because of what we bring to the table.

At Camp Sumatanga, for camps, classes, and Emmaus Walks, we come bathed in prayer. We get away from the outside world for a few days – no cell phone, no TV, no computers. We come anticipating that the Holy Spirit is going to show up. And the Holy Spirit seems to always show up.

One of my goals is to enter into other phases of my life with that same attitude. Prayer, presence to the moment, anticipating that the Holy Spirit will show up.

Thin places aren't limited by location – they occur anywhere that God is present.

street from the Lodge. Linda is hoping your Cluster will help fill that room!


Cluster Leadership Training gives newly elected leaders the opportunity to receive their packet of 2019 information from the Community Board.


