What Comes Next More Answers After Your Walk

In the last edition, I tried to answer a few common questions people have after completing their Emmaus Walk at Camp Sumatanga. Today, I want to continue the conversation with a few more.

How Are Board Representatives Chosen?

Each Cluster Grouping is represented by two Board Reps. If a grouping has two clusters, each cluster gets one representative. If there are three clusters in the grouping, two serve at a time on a rotating basis.



To serve as a Board Rep, you must have previously been a Walk Lay Director or an Assistant Lay Director (ALD). Board Reps are approved by the Team Selection Committee of the Cluster Grouping, serve for two years, and cannot serve consecutive terms.

What Do Board Reps Actually Do?

Board Reps serve as support and resource persons for Walk teams. The more experience someone has serving on a team, the more effectively they can fill this role.

They also help ensure that Emmaus guidelines and procedures are followed throughout each Walk, all while offering spiritual and logistical support to the Lay Director and the entire team.

How Often Do Board Reps Meet?

Board members are expected to attend the following:

- · Two overnight work sessions
- · Five Saturday afternoon meetings
- The Memorial Service and Training Event, which spans Friday evening and Saturday

The Saturday meetings are typically held during Walk weekends, from 1:00–4:00 PM. These gatherings are where a significant amount of business and decision-making takes place.

How Is the Board Chair Selected?

The Board Chair, also called the Community Lay Director (CLD), is selected annually from among the first-year board members. A Nominating Committee chooses someone to serve the following progression:

- 1. Assistant Board Chair (Year 2)
- 2. Community Lay Director / Chair (Year 3)
- 3. Past Chair (Year 4)

So yes—this is a four-year commitment! It's a lot of time, prayer, and work—but also deeply rewarding.

A Note from the Chair

It has been my honor and joy to serve as the Community Lay Director this year. I couldn't have asked for a more dedicated and faithful Board. Each member has offered their time, wisdom, and heart to ensure that our Walks run smoothly—like a well-oiled machine.

Last year, we formed a Strategic Planning Committee, led by Bill Rush, alongside other board members, Emmaus Community volunteers, and Tony Jones, representing Camp Sumatanga. Their goal? To strengthen the Alabama Emmaus community for the long haul.

Their work has already borne fruit.

We implemented their recommendations, with a special emphasis on Sponsorship and Reunion Groups. Participation

on Walks has grown, and more team members are stepping up to serve. Sandra May, one of the committee members, will take Bill's place as he rotates off the board. She'll join us as a new first-year rep—and we're blessed to have her.

I can't wait to see what God does next!

So... What's Next for Me?

In 2026, I'll still attend board meetings, visit Candlelight services when I can, and serve on teams if the Holy Spirit leads a Lay Director to call on me. I'll continue to serve my Cluster, my church, and most of all, my Lord and Savior—wherever I'm needed, until He says my work here is done.

And I hope that's not for a long time. There's still so much I want to do.

I'll see you at Candlelight in February.
