Galatians 2:20: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

A.W. Tozer in his book "The Crucified Life", writes about growing deeper in Christ in relationship with Him. The crucified life is important to understanding the dimensions of the Christian faith.

To live a crucified life is to embrace the thought of being crucified with Christ. This is where personal ambitions and desires are willingly surrendered to God. This is an active choice to align our lives with the example and the teachings of Jesus.



In order to be a follower of Jesus we are called to a life of surrender. This life of surrender is to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. This surrender challenges us to forsake our own will and plans in exchange for God's greater purpose. The thought of being crucified with Christ influences and reshapes our ongoing relationship with Jesus. This process requires self-examination, prayer and being open to God's leading and results in our lives becoming vessels through which God's grace can flow.

The journey in the crucified life comes with a cost.

The cost in discipleship comes with personal sacrifice, discomfort and sometimes loss.

The Holy Spirit plays an enormous role in empowering us to embrace and live out the crucified life. The Holy Spirit leads us to spiritual transformation and equips us to die to self and live the abundant life.

Cultivating a deeper relationship with the Holy Spirit involves several steps. A deeper relationship begins with a life of prayer where we engage in meaningful conversations with God. Saturating ourselves with Scripture allows us to listen to the still, small voice of the Holy Spirit. This is where we find peace and guidance in times of uncertainty. Practicing daily surrender is an aspect of growing in relationship with the Holy Spirit. Empowerment of the Holy Spirit helps us to see the importance of living in community. This brings about encouragement and accountability.

Understanding our call to live a crucified life is an invitation to profound spiritual transformation. Let us all surrender and accept the invitation to have our lives transformed by the power of God.

so there's ample time for prayer, preparation, and discernment. To be eligible, you'll need to be active in your Cluster and part of a Reunion Group (an accountability group).

Most people start by serving on back hall committees—like Agape, Refreshments, Meal Service, Housing, Worship, Speaker's Prayer Chapel, Music, or Tech. Some of these roles require staying at Camp, especially for those who live farther away.

You might also be invited to serve during:

- · Sponsor's Hour (Thursday night)
- · Candlelight (Saturday night)
- Closing (Sunday afternoon)
- Follow-Up, 72-Hour Prayer Vigil, Entertainment, or Photography

These roles are vital—and often just the beginning.

What Happens After That?

Once you've served for an entire weekend, a Lay Director may feel led by for Holy Spirit to invite you to serve in the Conference Room as a Table Leader or Assistant Table Leader.

If you've served in both roles, and have given a talk, you may be invited to serve as an Assistant Lay Director (ALD or "bell ringer"). After serving as ALD twice, you become eligible to serve as a Walk Lay Director.

Eligibility doesn't mean immediate selection—many faithful servants are also waiting. The best way to stay on the radar? Stay active, serve with gratitude, and remain open to the Spirit's leading.

Why Are Team Meetings Required?

Team members must complete 20–23 hours of training for preparation, typically across three or four Saturdays. These meetings are essential for planning, bonding, and staying aligned with Emmaus guidelines.

Guidelines are important. They've been shaped over decades of faithful experience. If you have an idea for improvement, bring it to your Board Representative—but never make changes on your own.

Why Do the Bell Ringers Follow Everyone Around?

The Assistant Lay Directors (aka bell ringers) are in charge of keeping the Walk on schedule—a schedule that's been prayerfully followed for over 40 years.

They also ensure every person is present before each talk begins. If someone wanders off and misses the bell, it can delay or even shorten sacred moments for others. It's a humble but crucial role.

Why Were Table Leaders Kept a Secret?

They weren't! You just didn't realize it.

On Thursday night, the Lay Director read from Luke 24—the story of two disciples walking to Emmaus, joined by a "stranger" they didn't recognize as Jesus. Just like in that story, the Table Leaders quietly walk beside you.

In fact, the Lay Director invited all team members to stand that night—you probably just didn't notice your neighbor stand. That's part of the joy for Table Leaders: to serve quietly, and witness your "aha!" moment.

In Closing... Let This Be Your Next Step

You've experienced the love, grace, and joy of the Emmaus community. Now it's your turn to share it with others.

Let's close with a song that says it best:

"Help Somebody Today"
