Lenses for Living

34 When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, 35 and one of them, an expert in the law, asked him a question to test him. 36 "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" 37 He said to him, " 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' 38 This is the greatest and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

-Matthew 22:34-40

The question posed here to Jesus was a devilishly tricky one. The rabbis had counted 613 commands in the Law. 613. Which ONE is greatest, they ask. While it was not at all unheard of for a rabbi to give a summary of the Law, this question, "Which one law is the greatest?", alluded to a commonly held view that all Law was equal. If all Law was equal, any human who attempted to rank the Law would be making a human presumption about the divine Law. In asking this question then, the asker was trying to get Jesus to disparage some part of the law, something that would surely be grounds for his arrest.

In his answer, Jesus points to two great foundations of the Jewish faith, of our Christian faith, and of his entire life and ministry. The first, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind,' is a portion of what was known to the Jews as the Shema, words that were part of prayers twice a day, words that were taught to children, words that Jews were known to utter as their last words.

The second, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself,' is from a section of Leviticus that underscores a vision of a world that is marked by just human relations and practical care of one another.

Jesus is saying here that these two things are the lenses through which we can see the entire Law.

Love of God and love of neighbor. These are how we test if we truly understand the Law, how we test if we truly understand what God is asking of us.

Love of God and love of neighbor. Jesus is quite clear that these are things we are compelled to do, they are our purposes in life.

Love of God and love of neighbor. We measure all that we do against these. Everything hangs on these.

Given this, we have some challenging questions to ask of ourselves:

Are we loving God, respecting God, serving God in all we are doing and saying?

Are we loving our neighbor, respecting and serving and caring for our neighbor in all we are doing and saying?

I am grateful to the Alabama Emmaus Community for offering a unique opportunity to practice love of God and love of neighbor but, as we know, these commandments are about more than what happens when we are serving within Emmaus. It is about more than what happens when we are serving within our churches. It is, quite simply, about what happens in every interaction we have and in every quiet moment we spend.

May we all be known, wherever we go, as those who lead with love, just like Jesus.
