Called to Serve: The Heart of the Emmaus Community

In our last Grapevine, I wrote about the importance of sponsorship in ensuring that Emmaus continues to thrive. Today, I want to highlight another vital element: servants willing to give their time and talents to serve on a Walk to Emmaus team.

Emmaus Walks simply cannot happen without people who are willing to step forward and serve. The mission of the Alabama Emmaus Community is to foster spiritual renewal by inspiring, challenging, and equipping church members for Christian action



in their homes, churches, workplaces, and communities. This is accomplished through the Emmaus experience—but it takes willing hands and hearts to make that experience possible.

To serve on a Walk team, you must have completed a Walk to Emmaus, a Cursillo weekend, a Tres Dias weekend, or another three-day spiritual renewal event recognized by the National Emmaus Movement, The Upper Room in Nashville, Tennessee. If you've had this experience, you are already part of the Alabama Emmaus Community and eligible to serve!

The Power of a Servant's Heart

Each Walk requires the dedication of 100 or more servants, ensuring that every aspect of the weekend runs smoothly. Every role is crucial—from creating a list of Cluster meetings for pilgrims' packets to leading as the Walk Lay Director. Each job, big or small, contributes to the greater mission of guiding others into a deeper experience of Christ's love.



Camp Updates

There are some really great updates going on at Camp! For one thing, the Refreshment Room has been repainted, and there is a strong possibility that the Conference Room and Pilgrim's Prayer Chapel will be also! Carpet in the Pilgrims' Prayer Chapel and the Speakers' Prayer Chapel has been replaced with carpet squares.

With these upgrades, there is a new procedure for hanging anything in the building. You may not ever use nails. For some things you may use tape, but it must be painter's tape. However, no tape may be used in the freshly painted Refreshment Room. Instead, plastic hooks from the ceiling tile frames and fishing line work well. And in the Retreat Center, no names will be attached to the hall doors, but to the door frames.

God never doubts His leadership, and we should also discipline our doubts. Never doubt the all-knowing God. Some times we nurture negative thoughts and doubts. This will always bring about discouragement and failure. Do not allow doubts to linger too long. Always replace doubts with thoughts of faith. Philippians 4:13 - "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."

What are our desires of being our own boss? Too often the desires are selfish, sensual, and oft times sinful goals. Discipline our DESIRES! James 4:7-8 shows us first to submit to God; resist the devil so he will flee from us. Let others see us dedicated to pleasing God. There is nothing sweeter than walking hand in hand daily with God. I John 3:22.

Discipline our DUTIES. Why waste time that you can use to lead others to salvation, a closer walk with God and spiritual growth? Always make time for God's work. We have all learned that we need to be the hands and feet of the outreach in which Jesus leads us. As your own boss, put that on your list of things to be every day. Close with this: Romans 1:6 - "Among whom are ye also the called of Jesus Christ." This is our job all the time, so be a good boss as you listen to the MASTER SUPERVISOR!!!

The Walk Lay Director with the guidance of the Holy Spirit is responsible for building the team, prayerfully inviting people to fill key roles. Team members gather at meetings before the Walk to pray, plan, and prepare for the pilgrims' journey, working together to create an environment where God's grace is fully experienced.

But service extends far beyond Emmaus weekends. Serving comes in many forms.

In our community and church one might:

- · Provide meals and clothing to those in need
- Visit the elderly and the sick
- · Teach a Bible study or Sunday school class
- · Tend to the church grounds
- Even small tasks, like cleaning out the refrigerator or changing lightbulbs, are acts of service that bless others and honor God.

Mission trips—whether across the world, in another state, or within your own community—also offer powerful ways to serve. And serving on weekends like Kairos, Chrysalis, and Emmaus deepens our relationship with God and strengthens our discipleship.

Are We Answering the Call?

Since COVID-19, many Lay Directors have struggled to build teams to the recommended size. A balanced team consists of:

- 1/3 new servants experiencing their first Walk team
- 1/3 who have served a few times
- 1/3 seasoned members with significant experience

Unfortunately, some of us have become complacent, assuming we are no longer needed. But the truth is, Emmaus needs you now more than ever. Perhaps it's time to step out of our comfort zones, change up the areas where we serve, and allow others the opportunity to serve where we once did and accept a position on an Emmaus team.

I urge you to begin praying now about how God is calling you to serve. The next time a Lay Director invites you onto a Walk team, I hope your answer will be a resounding "YES!" No matter what role you are asked to fill, know that you are serving Jesus by serving others—and that is our mission.

I leave you with this beautiful song by Bill and Gloria Gaither:

I Will Serve Thee

I will serve Thee because I love Thee; You have given life to me. I was nothing until You found me; You have given life to me. Heartaches, broken pieces, ruined lives are why You died on Calv'ry. Your touch was what I longed for; You have given life to me.

Let's answer the call to serve—because our willingness to serve makes Emmaus possible.

Board Bits

The Alabama Emmaus Board is currently working hard to bring the Pilgrim application process into the 21st century! Plans are in place to soon have the application online, possibly on the Community website, where the information can be entered and sent to the Emmaus office. Also very soon, there will be a Venmo account to enable fees to be paid electronically. It will be important to keep checking the Grapevine and the Community website for updates!



In similar fashion, the board voted in its March meeting to include a document with the Group Reunion cards given to Pilgrims that has QR codes to enable new Pilgrims to locate groups that meet electronically. While in-person meetings are always the best, there are times when meeting physically may not be an option. This document suggests several options, including Zoom and Google Meet. Some Reunion Groups have been meeting electronically ever since COVID, but this enables virtually all members of the Community at large to avail themselves of it. This effort is the result of work done by the Strategic Planning Committee created by the AEC board last year to revitalize the Community.



Yet another idea promoted by the Strategic Planning Committee is the creation of Emmaus branded merchandise. These items may soon be available for purchase to be given as gifts, or to be sold with the t-shirts on the Book Table during Walks. Again, be watching for announcements regarding these developments.


