
Some Clusters rotate to a different church each month. They said while it helped to get members from that church each month, regular members didn't (Please See Baker Page 3.)

The Alabama Emmaus Community Board held an overnight meeting May 30-31. One of the reports presented involved the progress being made with converting the payment of Pilgrim fees to a digital format. The Community Treasurer and Community Coordinator have worked through models that could soon make it possible to handle these payments through Venmo. So far only models have been created, and only Pilgrim fees are the focus at this time. But the possibility of this becoming an actuality is very real. attend as often because of the longer drive. Some have two designated churches that they do a rotation. Some meet at one church that is close to a central location for everyone every month. Most start at 6:30. A few at 6:00. Everyone agreed that Cluster meetings should not last past about 8:00 to allow those with children to get home and get them ready for bed.

The whole point is to come up with a plan that will draw members for a better attendance. Cluster meetings are where you get to know people that are interested in keeping their Fourth Days alive and making vital connections. These connections help build future teams for walks. Servers are needed. Training servers is important. We need those that have served on a committee many times to train and prepare others.

At the same meeting we had just selected the next 10 Walk Lay Directors for Walks 543-552 to start in August 2026 - May 2027. Each one has been called. Most have already accepted. After the Lay Directors have their training and get their materials, they will begin watching and listening for the Holy Spirit to lead them to the person that is needed. I know some of you that have never served are waiting to be called. Try to come to the Training Event held at Camp Sumatanga on August 9. The upcoming Lay Directors get the names of those that attend. Maybe the Holy Spirit will tell them that you are ready to serve. There is a Memorial Service for those members that have passed held on Friday night, August 8. All are welcome to attend. The application is attached to this Grapevine. A class on sponsorship has been added to the line-up.

At the end of Closing on nearly every walk everyone forms a big circle around the auditorium and sings the song, "Bind Us Together". I want to leave you with another song I remember singing to end MYF/UMYF meetings each week titled "Blest Be the Tie That Binds."


