## This season reminds us of hope in Jesus Christ

In my home church we have an Advent wreath, and we light the Advent candle every Sunday, the four weeks before Christmas. Advent means arrival or coming, and each Sunday the wreath reminds us to remember why Jesus came.

Usually there are four purple candles in a circle on evergreen branches with a taller white candle in the center.

A circle symbolizing the eternity of God, the white candle symbolizing Christ and each of the purple candles symbolizing Hope, Love, Joy and Peace.

The Christ Candle will be lit on Christmas Eve, symbolizing that Christ is the light of the world. This wreath is a reminder of who we are called to be as followers of Jesus.

Each week as we light a candle, there is a brief message on that specific candle. The first candle is HOPE. The dictionary defines hope as: "a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen. A feeling of trust."

November 29 was the first Sunday of Advent. Before the first candle was lit, there was a little video of our church children telling us what they thought hope means:

- · It is a present
- · It's being excited over something that will happen
- · It's belief in something or something you want, like what you want for Christmas
- · Hope is something that you are waiting for and you are excited about it.
  - · When we hope we wait and when we wait, we hope.

Is your heart filled with hope? What happens when your path is filled with loss and stress?

How can you walk in hope when you feel helpless inside? 2020 has been challenging and has even caused us to lose some of our hope.

But there is hope in Jesus, the one who came to earth as a baby to save us. Hope in Him is something deep within you that holds and secures you through the storms of life. He gives us HOPE to overcome and HOPE for eternity.

"May the God of HOPE fill you with all joy and peace, as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with HOPE by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

## Board suspends Walks until at least August '21

At its Dec. 5 meeting, the Alabama Emmaus Board of Directors opted to suspend Walks as scheduled and will tentatively consider resuming in August 2021. When Walks are rescheduled, the numbers will be moved as a block and will remain in order. Plans are in place to make decisions and give notice to Lay Directors and teams with ample time for preparation.

In addition to this change, Camp Sumatanga Executive Director Tony Jones has offered the use of the Lodge to the Community for Walks as an option in addition to McKinney-Atkins and the Retreat Centers. The Board has chosen to accept the offer of the Lodge. The necessary updates to material will be made as the schedule becomes known and in accordance with Camp renovations completed at that time.

In recent Board Meetings the number of Pilgrims per Walk was reduced to 21. This could vary according to space available when Walks begin and according to whether any COVID-19 restrictions remain in place at that time. Additionally, the number of pieces of agape requested for Walks was historically dropped from 80 to 60.

The Grapevine will continue to be published electronically and will be available to all Cluster Leaders and on the Community website.
