Be brave (CEB), be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9 (NLT)

While pondering this article, I'm sitting on the porch facing Little Lagoon in Gulf Shores. As part of my early quiet time before dawn, the tropical storm Nicholas is performing for me. It's an amazing lightening show, lightening to the south, to the east, and to the west.

The above scripture has been very much apart of my spiritual journey during the pandemic. My thoughts carry back to my early childhood. I was always afraid of needles, getting shots and going to the dentist. My mother would say, "Johnny be brave." It was drilled into my mind and inner being. And now in my senior years, being brave doesn't require a thought or intentional effort. I am so glad that my mother planted the positive words "be brave" into my being instead of the negative words "Don't be afraid." In my adult life, I can only think of one occasion when I was very much afraid. It was the first time I was shot at by the enemy while serving in Vietnam. My challenge for you is threefold: 1) Memorize Joshua 1:9; 2) beware of the positive or negative words you speak into the life of your child(ren) or grandchildren; and 3) when you become afraid/fearful, speak the words of Joshua 1:9 aloud into your inner being.
