The 2nd PSA International Photo Gathering 2024 in Indonesia was very successfully held three months ago on July 22-29, 2024, but it felt like yesterday. We are still talking about it and remembering all the fun memories. 222 participants from 22 countries landed in Yogyakarta on the 22nd of July. Some of them were travelling in groups but some were travelling alone. However, within seven nights and eight days, they blended together and became good friends. We travelled together to four different cities: Yogyakarta, Surakarta, Probolinggo and Mount Bromo with a total of more than 350 pieces of luggage and bags.

D-Day

It took one year of preparation by the Core and Support teams of PSA-PG Indonesia to make sure that every single detail of the schedule, program and logistics i.e. food, transportation, luggage,

hotel, documentation, decoration and many more things, were done according to the plan. Two months before the D-date, we assigned the Volunteers that we called Red Hats to create the "WhatsApp" group and contact the participants even before they came to Indonesia. The term Red Hats (volunteers that literally wore red hats) was introduced in the 1st PSA-PG 2023 India and we will continue to use them for the next PSA-PG.

Day 1

JULY 22, 2024

Participants were picked up at Yogyakarta International Airport and brought to the hotel for registration. The Volunteers greeted the participants, distributed the welcome kits and explained the

program. At night we had the 1st Gathering Dinner, a reunion for some people that already knew each other from the 1st PSA-PG India, and an introduction for those who joined for the first time.

Day 2

We started the day with the Opening ceremony of the PSA International Print Gallery Show in Gallery Katamsi, in Indonesia Institute of the Arts of Yogyakarta. The details of the gallery show can

be read at the International News section in this Journal. Then we had lunch and continued with photographing the Silver Smith. Around 3 p.m. we were heading to a restaurant located uphill where we could photograph the breathtaking scenery of surrounding Yogyakarta for the Opening ceremony of the 2nd PSA-PG Indonesia. We stayed there until sunset and then proceeded to Prambanan Temple to watch the Ramayana Ballet Show.

JULY 24, 2024

After breakfast, at 7 a.m. we drove to Borobudur Temple in Magelang City. Twenty-two minivans were escorted by Policemen to ensure a smooth one-hour journey to Magelang. After the

participants had the opportunity to climb up to the temple, Mandatara Dance was performed in front of the Borobudur Temple specially for the PSA-PG Indonesia guests. This performance required special permission from the Indonesian Heritage Agency with which we have a collaboration. In the afternoon we moved to Parangkusumo Sand Dunes where more than 30 young traditional dancers were ready to perform. The day was ended by visiting the Parangtritis beach during sunset.

We drove in the early morning to Mojolaban Artisans Village in Surakarta to take pictures of many village activities such as Batik Fabric artisans, Shadow Puppet Wayang artisans, umbrella

artisans, traditional instrument Gong artisans and many more. Participants were divided into 20 groups and each group rotated to each location so everyone had enough space and time to photograph the activities. Participants also had the opportunity to walk around by themselves to photograph the local daily activities including visiting the elementary school. Even though we had spent half a day in the village, many people felt

it was not enough time to capture the many photo opportunities. In the afternoon, we had lunch and continued to shop at the local batik and handicraft shops, before resting at the hotel. In the evening, we went for dinner and had a birthday party for those who were celebrating birthdays during the PSA-PG.

At lunch time, we visited Permata Beach where we photographed the local dancers, long dragon kites and children. To show PSA cares about the environment, we initiated a mangrove plantation near the beach area. At 2 p.m. we travelled to Mount Bromo for other activities.

It was a night where we appreciated everyone, participants and volunteers, for the company, hard work and most importantly the friendship that we shared. The grand event was held outdoors at the Amphitheatre Jiwa Jawa Resort with amazing lighting, big screen decorations, live music and great food.

We were sad, but had a warm feeling in our hearts. We split the group into half (more than 100 people) and continued the journey to Bali Island.



105 participants of PSA-PG flew to Bali Island and enjoyed the extended tour in Bali and on the August 3rd, most of the people flew back home with great memories. With such a big group
