

1826 Woodward Trust Deed (original)

This indenture made this twenty first day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & twenty six between William Woodward of the one part and Samuel Lewis & Benjamin Cogswell of the other part, witnesseth that the said William Woodward as well for and in consideration of the better securing of the poor children of his inmates as also for the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid at or before the sealing & delivery of this

Samuel Lewis & Brown Cogswell both in brick and for the next \$5 purchase hereinafter mentioned giving grants, alms, and coffee to be confirmed and by these presents doth give grant, alien and lease, convey, and confirm unto the said Samuel Lewis & Brown Cogswell their affigis successors and associates and the successors of such associates to be named and appointed as herein after directed all the following described real estate lying and being in brick county (Wy) commencing on Ye corner street at the North West corner of a tract heretofore conveyed to Mr. Guilford an acre lot and running from thence eastwardly with the line of said Mr. Guilford or his assigns four hundred feet more or less to the Eastern boundary of said lot thence with the Eastern boundary Northwardly four hundred feet thence Westwardly on a line parallel with the line first drawn across Greenwich street to a point from which a line drawn parallel with Greenwich will strike the Eastern boundary of a lot conveyed by the said Cogswell to the County of Hamilton known as Southwicks lot on line to be drawn to the North East corner of the land so conveyed to the County there on the Eastern boundary thereof to the East line of the land of said Woodward thence eastwardly on the said line to the place of beginning containing seven acres more or less; together with all and singular the hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion & reversionary interest remainder & reversionary rents, issues & profits thereof and all the Estate freight, tolls, interest property claims and demands whatsoever of him the said

William Woodward in and to the said premises and every part so
parcel thereof, &c. he have and to hold the foregoing land freehold or
Meant and intended so to be to the only proper benefit of the said
Samuel Long & Company because all their designs or successions by herein
after directed forever. Provided always that the land & tenement
herein before described and the rents, dues and profits that may
arise thereon are to be held upon and applied for founding and main-
taining a prescholar for the Education of poor children of the said
city of Cincinnati in reading, writing, arithmetic and English
grammar; the said School to be established in the said City of Cincin-
nati and to be managed and directed by the trustees in the said name
and their successors perpetually and to be founded and commenced
so soon as many are produced by said Lanes and remaining for such
purpose. By and said School with the premises herein before de-
scribed and every part & parcel thereof, to be managed by and under
the exclusive controul of three trustees, two of whom com-
-well Lanes & Anna Boggs. & the said William Woodward hereby
nominate & appoint to hold said places or offices during their lives
and hereby empower them to nominate their successors by will or addi-
tional appointment as in other cases which therefore are also hereby empow-
ered to nominate & appoint their successors and their successors to continue
to nominate & appoint their successors forever in the same manner
and hereby empower them to nominate their successors by will or addi-

But at any time it should happen that by reason of death or
resignation or any other cause there should be a failure to nominate
a successor or successors or if any one that succeeds should hap-
pen in either or both of the above mentioned trustships then that

made by the almighty Mayor & Aldermen of the city of Cin-
cinnati and the persons so appointed to hold their places seven
years and until their successors shall be appointed and if it
should so happen that there shall be no Mayor & Alder-
men then by the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Cin-
