

Whereas heretofore, to wit, on the first day of November, Eighteen hundred and twenty six, I William Woodward of the City of Cincinnati in the State of Ohio did by my deed duly acknowledged & executed convey to Samuel Lewis, Edmund Cogswell for the consideration in said ^{deed} mentioned certain lands tenements & hereditaments in City of Cincinnati lying on
Ly a more street four hundred foot front and extending the same width to Broadway and the same width west half way to main street as by effeience to said ^{deed} a more full and particular description of said land & premises will appear and whereas after the execution of said deed the said Lewis & Cogswell with one other trustee procured a charter incorporating the said Lewis Cogswell & Matthew O'Conor and their successors by the name & style of The Trustees of the Woodward Free Grammar School the letter to name the trust declared in said deed of conveyance which trust by effeience to said deed will more fully appear & And whereas of late to wit on the twenty fourth day of March in the year eighteen hundred and twenty eight the said William Woodward the more completely to carry ~~the~~ effect the objects contemplated in the said deed of conveyance said act of incorporation did make & execute a certain other deed being a deed of confirmation of said trust to set forth the uses & purposes declared in the said first deed of conveyance which last mentioned deed is executed to the said trustees in their corporate capacity & to their successors in office to be affected in the manner set forth in the said deed first named And whereas divers good and sufficient reasons exist that renders it desirable (for the purpose of making the conveyance aforesaid more extensively useful) to have

to certain extent the direction or application of said fund
so as to enable the said trustees & their successors in office
to establish a high school for teaching the higher branches
of learning & literature with the arts & sciences Therefore
be it enacted by the said Samuel Lewis & Edmund Cassinell
with Lewis Howell trustee of the said Woodward Free
Grammar school and their successors in office to make
such regulations in relation to stated property land &
money belonging to the said incorporation as shall be
most extensively usefull This Indenture witnesseth
that the said William Woodward in consideration of the
premises and in consideration of one dollar in hand paid
by them the said trustees has given granted aliened convey
ed released & confirmed by these presents doth give
grant convey and release & confirm unto the said Samuel
Lewis Edmund Cassinell & Lewis Howell in their
corporate capacity of trustees of the Woodward Free
Grammar school and to their successors in office
all and singular the lands tenements & premises
referred to & described in the several deeds of conveyance
to have & to hold the same unto them & their successors
capacity with full power to appropriate the funds &
lands & property held by them as aforesaid to the purpose
of education in any & every branch of learning & science
as to them shall appear most usefull and also with
full power to procure an alteration in their charter
so as to allow them in their corporate character
to establish a high school in the City of Cincinnati
for the uses & education of that description of children
as young men as is pointed out in the first deed aforesaid
referred to the said William Woodward declariny
hereby his intent to such alteration of the charter

ofersaid as shall by the said trustees & their successors in office by the general assembly of the State of Ohio be thought most likely to extend the advantages of learning and science among those who have not the means of deriving such advantages themselves proportioning the benefits thereof equally in the different wards of the City of Cincinnati without regard to religious opinions or differences of opinion on any other subject — provided always that the institution aforesaid or any other that may be established by the trustees aforesaid or their successors shall never be in any manner under the control of any particular denomination of religious people.
