Rifle Range Update

Most if not all of the dirt work has been completed on the new 200 & 300 yard range, We are addressing the standing water issue on the 100 yard range and should have that take care of shortly. As soon as the weather straightens out, and we can coordinate with various contractors and helpers, we will start on the shooting bench area and back stops. We're always open to volunteers for help. Just get a hold of myself , Bruce, Dan , Chris or Rick and we can put you to work. Hopefully we can get things completed by early summer.

Range Damages and Misuse:

It has become very apparent that we have a small group of members that either think the rules and regulations are for everyone else or plan don't care. The top boards on the backstop a the 100 yd. range have been shot up. Not just a few errant bullet holes but groups of 6 and 9 holes. WHY? There is absolutely NO REASON for this. If you can't hit a 4ft. X10ft. backstop you have no business on a rifle range. Shot shells were found lying on the ground also. There is a sign posted that specifically says NO BIRD SHOT OR BUCK SHOT. The trap ranges have a pattern board if you want to shoot a target or pattern your gun. Also, someone removed a broom and dustpan from the 100 yd. range. If you borrowed it return it. Members have moved target racks at the pistol range and dragged mats up on the bank. We place these racks and mats at certain locations for reasons. I you want them changed, contact the person in charge of the range. Do not just assume you can changes things because you don't agree with how things are set up. We as members are expected to respect our property and ranges. Volunteers have to maintain and repair our ranges and damages. It also causes unneeded expenses. The process of getting volunteers to do this gets harder and harder when things continually get damaged and rearranged because individuals just don't care. Please report anyone you see causing damage or not obeying the rules to our board members and officers.

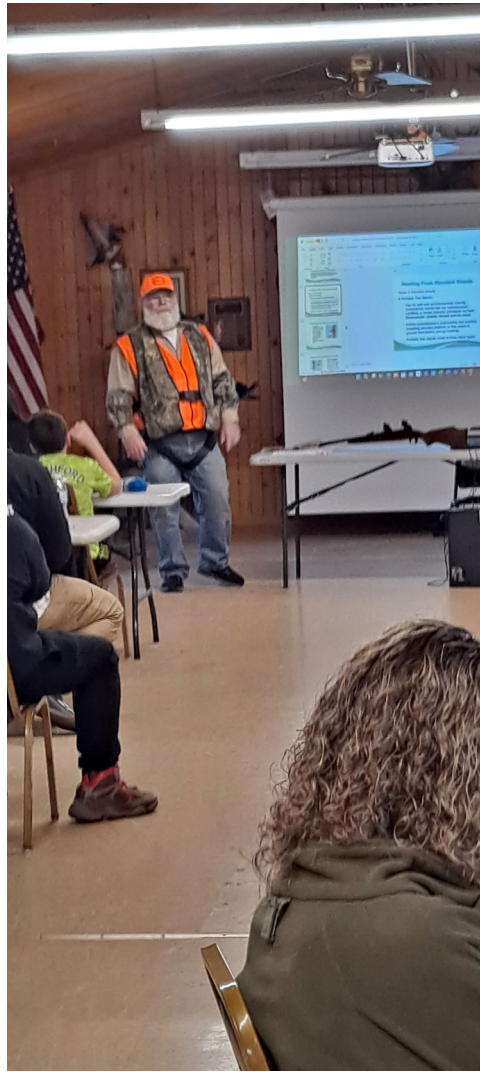
