Hemlock Woolly Adelgid located in Mason County

Hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA) is an invasive insect pest, originally from Japan, that can be seen on Hemlocks by the white woolly masses at the base of the needles. The insect feeds on the sap of the tree, depriving it of nutrients and causing it to die. It is only known to attack hemlock trees, but has caused mass die offs in at least 19 states along the east coast. Hemlocks are a very valuable tree ecologically, providing winter cover for mammals, nesting habitat for certain species of birds and shade cover for streams, helping to keep temperatures down in our cold water streams, improving trout habitat.

HWA was found in Summit Township of Mason County last winter, and more recently at Ludington State Park. Thanks to collaborative efforts between the Michigan Dept. of Natural Resources, regional CISMAs (Cooperative Invasive Species Management Areas) and regional Conservation Districts, treatments were underway in 2020 to protect the infested trees and those in surrounding areas.

Mason-Lake Conservation District staff will continue survey efforts in winter '20 – '21 as was done last year on private property, local campgrounds, township parks, etc. to determine if HWA has spread to other areas of the county. Most efforts are focused within 5 miles of Lake Michigan, as HWA is not known to occur further inland. If located, this will trigger a regional response to containing the infestation and working with the landowner to provide treatment on infested trees. We do not want this insect to continue spreading north!

What you can do:

Contact the Conservation District for a free site visit to check out your trees. Call (231) 757-3707 ext. 5

Keep an eye on your trees! Look at undersides of branches in December through March for small, white woolly balls. You can see them with the naked eye, or use binoculars to see higher branches. If found, note the location of the tree and, if possible, take photos of the infested branch. To avoid spreading HWA, do not collect sample branches or twigs. Report the find using one of these methods:

Email information or pictures to mason-lake@macd.org
Use the MISIN smartphone app from your app store or visit www.misin.msu.edu

Be mindful of your hunting and camping gear, RV's etc. If you are in areas with hemlock trees, just brushing against an infested tree could bring these insects along for the ride! Run clothing through a dryer and wash or brush off gear and vehicles before moving to a new area.

Remove birdfeeders from areas where hemlock trees are present. Birds may carry these insects to a birdfeeder where they can be picked up and transported by other birds.

Construction equipment could also spread these insects and other invasives. Ensure they are washed or brushed off before entering and leaving sites!

Anyone desiring a name to be placed on one of the bricks can purchase one for a donation of \$50. The brick can have 3 lines per brick and 14 characters per line.

The CPL Class that was held in November successfully certified 15 students.
