


Hunter Safety Workshop

Just for your information, Senate Bill 37 of 2019 has been given a hearing date before the Senate Natural Resources Committee. SB37, sponsored by Senator Curt VanderWall (R-Ludington), would allow the baiting and feeding of whitetail deer and elk in Michigan.

EDITORS CORNER

When you receive your new "**RED**" membership card, you will notice that you are being asked not to give out your card nor the gate combination to a non member. Rules of the Fin & Feather Club are that members may invite a guest to accompany them for different functions on club grounds.

Your Board believes trespassing is becoming a problem for the club and excessive damage to the shooting ranges are being done. Members are asked to follow all the rules of the ranges, when shooting. Shooting at proper ranges with the proper weapons, only firing at targets not wooden poles and targets that should not be shot at by high powered rifles.
