

High Braided Log Bun

- Middle part
- Please do not use a hairnet on the bun
- Ribbons braided into braids, one ribbon per section
- Trim ribbons as needed for hair length
- Highly recommend purchasing and using good quality bun pins (not flat bobby pins)

- For more secure style I recommend putting the hair in pigtails first

2 High Braided Buns

- Middle part
- Bangs can be left out (tiny and beginner only)



2 Bubble Braids

- Middle part
- All dancers must have FOUR bubbles on the head, amount of bubbles off the head will depend on hair length
- Must use elastics that match hair color

Rope Twist Bun

- Low, at the base of the neck
- Do not use a hairnet on the bun

Tips, Tricks, Products

- Dirty hair is always easier to work with than freshly washed hair
- Avoid gel and hairspray if needing to switch between multiple styles in the same day. Opt for a strong hold cream/wax instead for easier brushing out (and less fighting!).
- Buy all items to match the dancers hair color (pins, elastics, ponytails, bobby pins, bun pins, hairnets)
- Use product on all of the hair, not just the slick back part
- Always use a comb, a brush by itself never does the job as good as a comb!
- Often hairpieces are easier to secure with safety pins than with bobby pins
