


Build the ZS6BKW Multi Band Antenna

Radiated by "El Cheapo" N4ERM

Here's a great multi band antenna that is a modeled after the venerable G5RV only smaller. It is only \sim 93 feet long and perfect for our tall sand hills pine trees. I've used WD-1 (field telephone cable) with great success. The antenna in this version is fed by any length of 50 Ohm Coax (shorter the better), then to 36'5" (critical) of 300 Ohm ladder line. The drawing below shows a choke balun on the coax. I've never used one and the antennas seem to work fine. You can build the center insulator out of any non-conductive material. I've used plastic, acrylic and Plexiglas with equal success. Let me know if you need some.

Check out the antenna scan at the bottom. The SWR scale on the left indicates that 6 bands resonate with an SWR of 2 to 1 or lower. No need for an antenna tuner on these six bands!
