


Ten-Ten International (sometimes referred to as Ten-X) is dedicated to furthering amateur radio activity on ten meters (28,000 to 29,700MHz). The idea is that if we don't use it, we'll surely lose it! The radio spectrum is expensive stuff. In 2008, the FCC auctioned off the 700MHz band for a little over \$19,600,000,000.00! Some years earlier, the FCC took 2MHz out of the Amateur 1.25 Meter (222 MHz, formerly 220 MHz) band and gave it to FedEx!

Under the superb guidance of our current Ten-Ten Possum Trot Chapter leader, Bill KU4W, the Possum Trotters have won more Ten-Ten contests than any other chapter, and won by a wide margin. Get your Ten-Ten number now, build a simple 10-meter dipole, and help us continue to "Be Number One!"



Best \$12.00 I Ever Spent!


How is it that so often the whole is worth less than the sum of its parts? Probably your car is like that; costs \$600.00 to replace, but the whole car is only worth \$2,000.00! Mine is!!

The LCR-T4 Transistor Tester is something like that. At ~\$12.00, including shipping from China, the tester is a bargain.**

My junque box consists mostly of parts cannibalized from other donated electronics. But sometimes it's difficult to tell what some parts are: Is this resistor PNP or NPN? Is this a resistor or inductor? This little gadget lets you know.







It also lets you know the value of capacitors; disc, electrolytic, whatever. Just make sure the electrolytic are discharged before measuring them. Even shows you which pins are connected. I added the little white label over the compression holder to indicate the pins.
