



Windows 10

IF YOU ARE NOT INTERSTED IN WINDOWS 10, PLEASE EXIT AND DELETE, SORRY FOR THE BANDWIDTH...

With the looming expiration of the free Windows 10 on July 29th, if you are still undecided, here is a method to avail yourself of the free upgrade and save it for later, for the cost of a new hard drive. First make a recovery disc or secure a recovery disc of Windows 7 or 8 for your machine. Here is a good article to do this.

Then on Amazon or Newegg you can purchase a 500g hard drive for your laptop or desktop for about \$50.00:

Do some research and try to match your hard drive as best you can.. Lesser capacity will cost less, I picked 500G cause my drive was 500G. Open computer and swap the hard drive, boot the restore disk you made and reinstall Windows 7 or 8 to the new drive.

Get the windows 10 upgrade, and allow it to install, make take overnight...Swap back to your old hard drive, and save the new hard drive until you decide, or put Linux on it...

Word is, after July 29, the Windows 10 can cost upward of \$100.00...






