ARRL November Sweepstakes

CW: 5-7 November (logs due Nov 22)
Phone: 19-21 November (logs due Dec 6)
Contest begins at 2100 UTC on Saturday afternoon and ends at 0300
UTC on Sunday



The ARRL's annual November Sweepstakes. Sweepstakes has been in operation since 1930. Sweepstakes paused during World War II but came back stronger than ever. It's a competition between North American stations – individuals, teams, and clubs. For many US and Canadian hams, it is their first contest operation and remains a regular event on their yearly schedule for a lifetime. The contest is somewhat unique in that each station may only be contacted once and the number of different recognized locations ("multipliers") is limited to the ARRL and RAC sections.

Stations that work all of the sections is called a "Clean Sweep." A "Cleans SWEEP" entitles the station to obtain an ARRL Clean Sweep coffee mug. Don't forget is split into four sections: Ontario North (ONN), Ontario East (ONE), Ontario South (ONS), and Greater Toronto Area (GTA). This means a Clean Sweep requires 83 sections!

If you log on the computer be sure your contest logging software is up to date. Paper logs and summary sheets are available on the Sweepstakes web page. The preferred method of log submission is by email.

Operation will be held on the following bands 10m, 15m, 20m, 40m, 80m and 160m. No WARC bands are allowed in the Sweepstakes. Although the Sweepstakes is held over a thirty (30) hour period, you may only operate twenty-four (24) hours. Off times must be at least thirty (30) consecutive minutes. Listening times count as operating time.


The November Sweepstakes consists of eight categories: A - Low Power, B - High Power, Q - QRP, M - Multioperator (High or Low Power), S - School Club, U - Unlimited (High or Low Power). If you are operating by yourself without an amplifier, then you are an "A" category station. If you operate by yourself with an amplifier then you are a "B" if you use an amplifier. If you use information from a spotting network to locate stations to work, you are a U category station and can submit your log as High or Low Power.

The contest exchange has five (5) parts: Your Call Sign, Serial - the number of the contact in sequential order, Precedence - your category (A, B, M, Q, S, or U), Check - the last two digits of the year in which you were licensed and your ARRL Section.

The ARRL makes the PINS (Participation In November Sweepstakes) program for 2016. Anyone who completes 100 contacts on CW or Phone during Sweepstakes is eligible to purchase a Participation Pin. Pins are based on claimed scores. The pin includes the mode of operation and year on them. Pins cost \$8 each including postage and handling. Pins will be shipped after all logs are verified. To order your pins, attach a note to the front of your summary sheet indicating the number of pins ordered along with your check. If you enter electronically, send a copy of your summary sheet with a note and your check attached to Sweepstakes PINS, ARRL Contest Branch, 225 Main St, Newington, CT 06111.

Clean Sweep Mugs Commemorate working your "clean sweep" by purchasing your 2016 November Sweepstakes mug. To earn your mug, work all 83 ARRL/RAC sections during the CW or Phone November Sweepstakes. Mug awards are based on claimed scores. Mugs \$15 each including postage and handling. Your mug will be shipped after all logs and mug orders have been processed and verified. Supplies are limited.




