

No More Paper Licenses...Unless You Ask For It!

Starting February 17, the FCC no longer will routinely issue paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission they prefer to receive one. Licensees will be able to print out an official authorization, and an unofficial "reference copy" from the ULS License Manager. The FCC said applicants/licensees who include a valid e-mail address under "Applicant Information" in the ULS will receive an official electronic authorization via e-mail. New license applicants who don't provide a FCC Registration Number at the examination point will receive a printed license and a FRN and temporary password to access the Commission Registration System (CORES).


2 METER J-POLE ANTENNA

When it comes to saving money in Amateur Radio, one of the areas in which Hams can really "cut costs" is antennas. For 2 meters, this J-Pole is hard to beat. It is low cost, omni-directional and it works (ask anyone who has used one).

The antenna can be built out of practically any conducting material. I've built "poles" out of aluminum and copper tubing, steel electrical conduit (EMT tubing) and out of stiff wire with about equal success. Materials can even be mixed. One fellow in Florida used his steel flag pole for the mast, measured the appropriate length down from the top and attached a piece of EMT. I've also built a pocket portable model out of 300 α TV twin lead.

If you follow the dimensions provided, you probably won't have to worry about tuning the antenna. If you're fussy, tuning may be accomplished in a variety of ways to achieve a low SWR:

 Use hose clamps at the coax conductors and slide the coax conductor feed point (especially on the 19" matching stub section) up and down prior to fastening.
2. Move the 19' matching stub up and down with respect to the shorting strap.
3. Use smaller tubing inside the top of the stub and slide it up and down within the stub.



One final note. The amount of mast <u>under</u> the shorting strap is <u>not</u> important. I built one of these J-poles out of EMT and nailed the base of the mast to the top of the tallest tree in my yard.
