MISO Saves the Day!!! by Bonnie Williamson KF4LVF

After many unsuccessful attempts to get on the air with PSK, I finally resorted to buying a Rig Blaster Plug-N-Play digital modem from West Mountain Radio — not only for its simplicity of use, but also for its smaller size and portability. It worked quite well on my older HP laptop computer. I recently had to replace the computer because it finally just quit working completely. The newer laptop I bought, however, was only configured with a single port to attach a speaker. No port for a speaker and another port for a microphone. And that, friends presented a serous problem. Whether you run PSK using any of the Rig Blaster modems, or any other digital devices, the device itself needs to connect to your computer through both a mic AND a speaker port.

Searching various ham related websites, I finally found a nifty little device that solves the problem altogether. The place to look is (BuxComm.com). The device is the MISO (Mic In / Speaker Out), a USB sound card device that's a bit smaller than a computer flash drive, and it's sole purpose for being is to provide you with both mic and speaker connections. (Note: once you open the enclosed attachment of the actual BuxComm webpage, click ton the little blue MISO device in the banner for full details and further information).

Before connecting your digital modem to your radio, simply plug the MISO into an existing USB port on your computer, connect the mic plug of your digital modem to the mic port / connect the speaker plug of your digital modem to the speaker port. The MISO will work on any laptop computer= and with all computer operating systems when you need to have the dual connections for both mic and speaker.

At a cost of \$9.95 + \$6.00 ship-ping and handling, it's by far, the best \$15.95 I ever spent! What's more, EUREKA, IT WORKS!!! PSK is, FINALLY, up and running the way it was MEANT to!!! I'm a Happy Camper!! Problem SOLVED!!!
