


Build is Better than Buy! Radiated by "El Cheapo," N4ERM

Cheap Helping Hands


Almost every Amateur has run into a situation where an extra set of hands would be useful. Even the Ham who is not "into" construction has almost certainly picked up a soldering iron in one hand, solder in the other, and found himself out of hands to hold the wire together with the connection! This little tool helps to solve this problem.

You'll need a suitable chunk of wood, some 8- or 10-guage copper wire, some spring-type clothes pins, and some odd hardware. I also used some alligator clips. Suitable ones are available at 12 for \$3.49 at Radio Shack (RS 270-380). Now all there is to do is to apply some imagination to visualize what you want - then just go ahead and build it.

The clothes pins and wood can be used to hold things (helping hands) in two basic ways: Using both jaws of the clothes pin to hold, or using the single jaw (note the spring is fastened to wood block) to hold against the block of wood. The stiff copper wire also becomes an extra hand to hold solder close to a component, or holding whole circuit boards. There's what mine looks like:



Using the sketch below as an aid, why not build your own set of helping hands? You'll be glad you did.
