

February 2015 Club Meeting Minutes

On February 16th the Cape Fear Amateur Radio Society meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by **Van N4ERM**. The meeting was held in the Auditorium of the Science Building at Methodist University. **Van N4ERM** led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance. **David KR4OE** led the invocation. **Van N4ERM** led the introductions in the normal CFARS style.



A motion was made by **Kelly N4EWG**, seconded by **Bill KU4W**, to approve the minutes of the January meeting. By vote the motion carried. The following changes were discussed: **Steve KK4EYN** is

out of the area and should be removed as the Emergency Coordinator. A new Emergency Coordinator will be announced. **Reggie KK4NJC**, webmaster, has a new call sign that should be listed in the Officers and Coordinators sidebar. CFARS patches are now available from **Chuck KJ4RV**.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer: Chuck KJ4RV gave the treasurer's report. We are still solvent.

Repeater: Bill KU4W told the club the repeaters were operational albeit noisy at times. The tower and equipment are needing maintenance, specifically spot painting the tower and tightening the guy wires. This will be taken on by various members of the cub in the March and April time frame.

Net Manager: Chuck, KJ4RV gave the net report. He reminded us these were our repeaters and encouraged all to join in the various nets.

Health & Welfare: Van N4ERM mentioned **Don KI4ZL** is still in rehab. He would appreciate visitors. **Becky**, **XYL of Chuck KJ4RV**, is home and doing well. **Doris**, **XYL of AE4FZ**, is doing well at home.

Old Business: Van N4ERM reminded the club the NC QSO Party is coming up on the 1st of March. He has secured cabins at Smith Lake Recreation Center. We will setup on Saturday morning after breakfast. Irv K3IRV made a motion, seconded by Dan KW4BG, to reimburse Van N4ERM \$180.00 for the cabin rental. By vote the motion carried. There was discussion of the contest and scoring. Members that are not operating at Smith Lake were asked to listen to their radios and assist in spotting for the several bonus stations so we can maximize our bonus points. Van N4ERM indicated the new budget. He asked we set aside money for two (2) tables and four (4) chairs at each of the local Hamfests: Shelby, Raleigh, Benson and Charlotte. Kelly N4EWG made a motion, seconded by Irv K3IRV, to reimburse Van N4ERM \$84.00 for securing the tables. By vote the motion carried. Irv K3IRV spoke of the Cumberland County Preparedness Expo on April 11th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to spotlight Ham Radio's place in disaster preparedness. The cost for a booth at the expo is \$100.00 and a door prize. Irv K3IRV, made a motion, seconded by Bill KU4W, to secure a booth. By vote the motion carried.

New Business: Van N4ERM mentioned the budget. He mentioned several of the clubs in the area had received grants from various entities (Homeland Security among others). Funds were still available. **Van KG6HGY** suggested the tower, antennas cable will need replacing at sometime. **Van KG6HGY** volunteered to make an itemized list of necessary equipment (Tower, antenna, LMR-400, radios, repeaters, crane services, ect) and total the expenses. He will report back to the club at a later date.

Build is Better than Buy "el Cheapo," N4ERM

BX-184 Voice Keyer Kit

Most amateur radio operators do not have an internal voice memory for transmitting. If you want such a convenience feature you can buy an add-on such as the Kenwood VGS-1, build one such as the greeting card voice keyer, April 1995 QST, pp 28-29 (el Cheapo's favorite), use any of several computer-to-radio voice keyers, or buy a kit such as the BX-184. I bought the complete kit, including handset from the German amateur Radio Club (DARC) at http://www.box73.de/download/bausaetze/BX-184 en.pdf/. There's an order form at the bottom of the page. Cost of the complete kit including circuit board, microphone, shipping, etc. was \$69.00. I paid via PayPal.

The keyer features Pre-assembled replacement board for the original PCB of the Yaesu microphones MH-31, either the A8J or B8 models. It is a plug-in substitute for many Yaesu transceivers (FT-450, 817, 857, 897, 900, 950, 2000). Can also work with some modification with Icom (706xx, 7000), Kenwood and some others. Record and playback of a voice message of up to 60 seconds in length. Single playback or repeated playbacks with interrupts of 3, 6 or 10 seconds selectable. Playbacks can be cancelled by pushing the microphone PTT switch.

Although the kit is mostly preassembled, some components must be soldered to the PCB. VERY detailed instructions (with pictures) are on the web page above. One SMD capacitor needs to be soldered across the electret microphone. A second SMD capacitor is recommended for ICOM transceivers. The capacitor is small as a grain of rice and care must be taken to get it right!

I'm pleased with the way the mic works. Just a press of the microphone and it sends a voice CQ until you stop it. It's easy to set up and use. Lots of voice-saving in the works.

2015 NC QSO PARTY

The North Carolina QSO Party will be held from 1500 UTC on 03/01/2015 – 0059 UTC on 03/02/2015. Stations may operate the entire contest period. The goal of the qso party is to activate as many North Carolina counties as possible. North Carolina stations may work other North Carolina stations and other states. Stations outside of North Carolina can only work North Carolina stations during the qso party.

The North Carolina QSO Party will have the following categories of operation: single-op, mobile, mobile "lone ranger", expedition and club stations and digital.

Awards will be given for CW, Phone, Mixed Modes, QRP, Mobile and Mixed Mobile, Club and Expedition stations from North Carolina. An Award will be given for the station that works the most North Carolina Counties. Awards will also be given to stations outside of North Carolina.

No cross-band, repeater, satellite or internet transponders may be used for contacts during the QSO Party. North Carolina stations may work any other station. The following bands are allowed in the QSO Party: 80/75, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 meters. WARC bands are not valid contacts for this qso party. Contest exchange is Call Sign and North Carolina County.

Scoring contacts will be as follows: SSB are worth 2 points per each QSO, CW are worth 3 points per each QSO and Digital are worth 3 points per each QSO. The same station can be worked on different modes. Log entries should include date, time, mode, call sign, state and county, and/or Canadian Province or DX location.

There will be fifty (50) bonus points available to include NI4BK (Battleship NC), W4DW (RARS Club Station) Bill McDowell K4CIA, any station in Person (PER) county, any station in Surry (SUR) county and NC4QP. If all six of the bonus stations are worked, a sweep, then two hundred (200) bonus points are available. Mobile and expeditions gain one hundred (100) bonus points for each county activated with at least one (1) QSO. To determine your final score, multiply the total QSO points times the total multiplier value. Add bonus points after the multiplication.

Logs should be submitted in Cabrillo format. Logs must be received by March 22, 2015. Logs may be submitted electronically to www.@ncqsoparty.org. You can email your log to logs@ncqsoparty.org. If you want to send in a paper log then mail it to NCQSO Party, c/o Marc Sullivan W4MPS, 322 Windham Way, Clayton, North Carolina 27527.
