



COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer: Chuck KJ4RV gave the treasurer's report. The club is still fine as turpentine.



Build is Better than Buy! Radiated by "El Cheapo," N4ERM

PORTABLE POWER TO THE PEOPLE

Take a look at these photos:





I used to recommend that every ham carry a portable power supply like the big yellow one on the left. In addition to providing enough power to start a car, it was good for emergency or portable field operations. The power supply (really a sealed lead acid battery or SLA) came with its own AC charger (pictured), jumper cables, a power indicator, a light, and two vehicle power adapters (cigarette lighter plugs) that provided 12 VDC. It also had an air compressor. It weighed in at 17 pounds. You may have seen the power supply connected to a solar cell and QRP radio at any of the last several Field Days.

Now I carry the Instaboost Pilot, as shown in the black pouch on the right in the photos. It is really a Lithium Polymer battery (LiPo). It too comes with its own AC and DC charger, jumper cables, power indicator, a light that can glow steady or signal SOS in emergency, a vehicle power adapter that provides 12 VDC at 10 Amps and a USB port that provides 5 VDC at 2 amps. Unlike the yellow power supply, it has no air compressor. All of that and it weighs in at less than $1/10^{th}$ the size and weight of the yellow beast. The battery itself fits easily into your back pocket.

I got mine at Lowes. They've reduced the price from \$99.00 to \$69.00. I justified the purchase based on the savings in size and weight.
