Here is some Amateur Radio lore for your reading enjoyment

Some Amateur Radio stations, especially DX, get carried away in ending a QSO "Best regards to your family and friends." "I wish you and yours health and happiness for all of your new years and birth-days." "God bless you and all of your future generations." While all of this may be acceptable in voice mode. It isn't acceptable in digital or CW.

Our predecessors in the hobby used "73" to end their contact with each other. It is the Amateur Radio operators way of saying best wishes, happy birthday, happy new year to your and yours, ect.

Later, Citizens Band operators adopted "73" for their own use. Incorrectly saying 73s or seventy-thirds. They are CBers not Hams.

Courteous Amateur Radio operators still say "73" at the end of a QSO. Some use in in voice or written communications to other Hams.

The point is that is is simply "73." Saying or writing 73s or 73's is incorrect. Saying or writing seventy-thirds identifies the speaker as a CBer.

Let's get it right!



NC QSO Party

The 2013 NC QSO Party will be held on February 24th starting at 1500 UTC until February 25th ending at 0059 UTC. There will be the following categories: Single-op, Mobile, Expedition and Club stations. NC stations may work everyone. Send call sign and NC county. Out of state station may only work NC stations. Send call sign and QTH. A signal report is optional. Contacts may not be made by use of repeater, satellite, internet

transponders or cross-banding. Bands for operation are from 2 meters through 80 meters. WARC bands are not allowed for this goo party.

Suggested Operating Frequencies CW – 3.540, 7/040, 14.040. 21.140, 28.040, 50.040 SSB –3.860, 7.260, 14.260, 21.360, 28.360, 50.160

Power Categories include QRP at 5 watts or less. Low Power at 150 watts or less.

Scoring for the qso party is as follows:

QSO points – 2 points for phone qso's and 3 points for cw qso's.

Multipliers are the 100 NC counties, 50 US states plus DC, 14 Canadian providences and 1 DX contact.

Bonus Points are available for the gso party.

50 points for working NI4BK aboard the USS North Carolina, 50 points for working W4DW (RARS club station), 150 points for working both NI4BK and W4DW. 50 points for working Cherokee county, 50 points for working Dare county or 150 points for working both Cherokee and Dare counties.

For final scoring multiply the total QSO points times the total multiplier value. Add bonus points after the multiplication.

Logs should be submitted in Cabrillo format if they are submitted electronically. All logs must be received by April 1, 2013.

All licensed amateur radio operators may participate and submit logs for any applicable awards.

Final results will be published on the NC QSO Party web site.
