This is still in limbo until the University has the opportunity to move their radio systems to their new site, once this is done, they will contact us to remove the tower. Methodist University is waiting until a ditch can be dug from the Stadium to the Public Safety Building. David and Mike have spoken with the County Facility Manager about moving the repeaters to Highsmith Rainey, they have 3 towers with space available and David said the charge for renting the space will possibly be \$10.00/year/repeater based on the fee that State Forestry is charged for their repeater. The County Facility Manager is working on a proposal to send to the County Commissioners for their approval. A motion was made by Larry N4USB seconded by Bobbi N4KAY, to approve moving to Highsmith Rainey when the time comes. By vote the motion carried. Ben KM4ODT, Mike K4JWX and Ed N4ESA have volunteered to help Bill KU4W with the repeaters.

**New Business:** Fred N4ZCG reminded us of the 10-10 SSB Contest on August 4 - 5. Larry N4USB has invited anyone who desires to come to his place to pick blueberries. Make your way up there to give them a hand and check them out. **Kelly N4EWG** has *Possum Trot Certificates* for the following Possums. Give Kelly a call to get your very own Possum Trot Certificate suitable for framing and putting in a place of honor of your south wall. PT # 3551 K4CLP; PT # 3557 KK4ZAU; PT # 3562 N4CDJ.

**Program:** George KM4ODS gave a Field Day Wrap-up. He asked for all present to give a brief account of what each individual had learned at this Field Day. Some of them were: We need more operators at each of the stations; We need to familiarize the operators on the various radios prior to operations; The Kids Program was a huge success with the children who participated; We should look into renting Canopies instead of the old shelters; We need some training on the Logger program; We need to commit to our word, i.e. be there if you say you will be there; We need to do the tower maintenance prior to setup; Each of us needs to get familiar with the radios we will be operating at a point prior to sitting down for operations; and finally, we need to use each other to learn and to teach ourselves and others. We have a wealth of knowledge and experience and we can pass that on to others.

George said we had made all the bonus points with the exception of making satellite contact, but that was not due to lack of trying. The GOTA station made 240 of a possible 500 points. 2309 total contacts were made for this Field Day between the CW, SSB, VHF and GOTA stations. All our supporting documentation has been sent in, though the last day for submissions is July 24. We are waiting for the final results to be tallied and scored at this point.

**Door Prize Drawing: Marty W4MLW** held the drawing. **Ferguson** won a Kenwood TM-281a two meter mobile radio (prize was open to those who participated at Field Day.) **David KR40E** won a gallon of fresh ripe blueberries donated by **Larry N4USB**, picked fresh this afternoon. **Larry N4USB** won a mini survival kit donated by **Van N4ERM**. Finally, **David KR40E** won the ubiquitous multi meter.

A motion was made by **Bonne KF4LVF**, seconded by **Dan KW4BG**, to adjourn the meeting, By vote the motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm. We had thirty-six (36) members and two (2) guests at the club meeting. The next club meeting will be August 20, 2018.


In 1918, the Chief of Field Artillery, General William J. Snow, seeking an area having suitable terrain, adequate water, rail facilities and a climate for year round training, decided that the area now known as Fort Bragg met all of the desired criteria.

Consequently, Camp Bragg came into existence on Sept. 4, 1918. Camp Bragg was named for a native North Carolinian and Confederate General, Gen. Braxton Bragg for his actions during the Mexican-American war. Prior to its establishment as a military reservation, the area was a desolate region. Huge forests of Longleaf and Loblolly pines covered the sandy area. About 1729 Highland Scots began cultivating the land in the Longstreet Presbyterian Church area in what was to become part of Fort Bragg.

Thought this might an opportunity for CFARS to "show off our stuff," possibly with a 1 X 1 special event call sign, operating from the post (back to Smith Lake, perhaps [it's on the post, but does not require an ID card]), operate for the day or the week, ... you get the idea.
