

It is close to the Cumberland/Hoke/Robeson county lines, has plenty of open space. There was some discussion and talk of it being a possible NC QSO party site location.

David KR4OE has spoken with Methodist University, the university closing for the hurricane, and has indicated that **Allen Pier** has not completed the work for the University move. We have sent a letter to the County Commissioners to allow us to use the Highsmith-Rainey Hospital site for our repeaters. Help out if you can. **David KR4OE** appointed (drafted) a Nominating Committee for slate of officers for next year. **Chuck KJ4RV** was drafted to chair the Committee.

The logs qsls have been posted to QRZ, eQSL, and LoTW. **Gene N4ANV** presented archival copies of the photograph used for the qsl card to **Van N4ERM**, **George KM4ODS**, **Chuck KJ4RV**, **Fred N4ZCG**, **Paul K4PGM** and **Larry N4USB**. Gene also threw out that next year is the 50th Anniversary of CFARS. Something to think about.

DMR TO GO!

DMR is one of the fastest growing new modes in amateur radio. I decided to try it out when I discovered how very inexpensive the radios were and all the possibilities for it's use. After my initial introduction into installing code plugs and finding local repeaters that I could reach, I started to explore open spots and how they could improve my enjoyment of my DMR HT. Spots are basically a mini repeater that connects to the Internet and allows connection to repeaters and other spots all over the planet. Using a spot,(and in my case a "nano spot") allows me to connect to any talk group used in DMR. All I need is the Nano Spot, a battery, and connection to the Internet. Using my cell phone's hot spot feature I am able to use my

DMR radio in my vehicle and carry on QSO's wherever I go.

I purchased several waterproof boxes while they were on sale from a tool distributor to use for radio equipment while in the field or traveling. They set in my shack for months while I was busy with other projects. I had already decided to use one to encase and protect my nano spot and battery for mobile use. Fred N4ZCG, beat me to getting one completed but that didn't stop me because I wanted to have something I could grab and go and protect my I investment as I travel.





The foam inserts that were included in the cases make

it easy to carve out just the correct size for protecting what's inside. It took very little time to mark out the shape and remove the blocks that would allow the pieces to be inserted snugly in the case.

The largest of the three sizes I had was still not large enough to house all the components I wanted to have available so I decided to use the smaller one for the nano spot, battery and 120V power supply. The mid size case would house the HT, charger, power cord, extra battery and speaker Mic. Now with just two small con-

tainers I could carry all my DMR equipment. The photos show how

the cases look and how well the equipment fits inside.

I am now traveling with my DMR equipment and enjoy it where ever I go. Hope to catch you on DMR soon.
