He reports that check-ins are down for the last several weeks and hopes they get better as we get out of the holiday season and everyone gets back to a more normal schedule.

**New Business:** Chuck KJ4RV will make our annual property inventory. **Bob WA4WHV** will do our annual financial audit and they will report back by the April meeting. **Bill KU4W** reminded us of the upcoming 10-10 winter SSB contest. CFARS came in 1<sup>st</sup> in the Fall CW and Digital contests. **Mark KN4OCA** was one of our guests. He introduced himself as the head of the Red Cross Chapter in Moore County, and presented some lessons learned by the organization from Hurricane Florence. He is teaching Technician Classes in Moore county and encouraging all the new hams to get involved and join their local amateur radio clubs and to get involved with emergency services. **Van N4ERM** reminded us that we are coming up on the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of CFARS this November and suggested we investigate setting up a Special Event station to commemorate the event. We need folks for publishing the event, coordinating QSL cards, getting the SE call sign, etc. **Doug KK4MZR** is involved in CERT and they will be participating in Winter Field Day and will be looking for help with contacts on 10/20/40 meters and VHF/UHF for the event. Field Day was discussed briefly, we need someone to step forward to head Field Day. Think about it and throw in your hat at the next meeting. **David KR40E** reminded us that our Swapfest will be at the Cumberland County Shrine Club on Saturday, August 10, 2019.

**Program:** Larry N4USB asked for suggestions for future programs. One will be FT-8. He introduced tonight's program: SHOW AND TELL. Larry N4USB showed a 1924 radio used by his grandfather. It originally sold for \$105.00. It is for sale to interested parties. Van N4ERM showed off a Micro BITx transceiver, a 5 band cw/ssb he built. He showed a QRP Labs QCX 30m cw transceiver he built from an inexpensive kit. He gave away a 3 element 2m yagi, a dual band VHF antenna, a 6m dipole, and two 9:1 baluns. Ron K4FET showed off a Vibroplex bug/straight key/iambic keyer he recently came into possession of, and a foxdelta.com antenna analyzer and graphs of his antenna farm. Will KN4OTA showed off his Tdx One HT and a 3d printed HT he printed. Chuck KJ4RV showed off an impressive collection of stuff he built: a Western Electric tone pad generator for setting PL tones, a ProsKit suction circuit card holder, a electrometer lightning detector, a homebrew ammeter, a homebrew electret microphone, a home built 3 position key switch (one keyer to 3 radios), a couple of QRP transceivers, and a Buck regulator (30 amps in -3 amps out).



### **Ten-Ten News**



It was decided back in November board meeting to add two new classifications/ categories to the 10-10 QSO Parties, LOW POWER AND HIGH POWER. These changes have just recently been made and will be effective beginning with the Winter Phone QSO Party February 3-4, 2018.

The following changes are as follows:

Entrants may submit a log in ANY of the following classifications:

**QRP:** Includes single station operators and can also include OM/XYL teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers. CW/Digital operations max 5 watts and Phone operations max 10 watts during the entire event.

LOW POWER: Same as QRP listed above except that output power for CW/

Digital operations is max 50 watts and Phone operations is max 150 watts during the entire event.

HIGH POWER: Same as ORP listed above except that output power for CW/Digital operations is

**HIGH POWER:** Same as QRP listed above except that output power for CW/Digital operations is max 100 watts and Phone operations is >150 watts for the entire event.

THE HEADER OF ALL LOGS MUST NOW INDICATE THE FOLLOWING IN THE CATEGORY SECTION:

QRP LOW POWER HIGH POWER CLUB MOBILE

# 2019 NC QSO Party

The NC QSO Party will be held from 1500 UTC February 24 to 0059 UTC February 25, 2019. Stations may operate the entire contest period. The following categories are operating in the contest: Single-Op, Mobile. Expedition and Club. In-State Stations work everyone. The exchange will be call sign and NC county. Use the county abbreviations as needed. Out of State Stations work NC stations only. Send call sign and QTH (State, Province, or "DX".) A signal report is optional. Mobile stations may be worked each time they change counties. A mobile station may operate on a county line but no more than two (2) counties may be given at one time. No wet county lines are permitted. No 160, WARC, or above 2 meters. Suggested operating frequencies (MHz) CW: 3.540, 7.040, 14.040, 21.040, 28.040, 50.040, 144.040.

Phone: 3.860, 7.260, 14.260, 21.360, 28.360, 50.160 (SSB), 52.040 (FM), 144.260 (SSB), 146.520(FM). Digital: (Use standard digital frequencies per band plan) No cross-band QSOs are allowed. No repeater, satellite, or other relaying device may be used to complete a QSO for award credit.

## VE Testing Session

Three (3) candidates were present for the testing session. All three (3) candidates passed exams.
